**"SECTION 5. RED RIVER VALLEY WRITING PROJECT.** The operating expenses line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$20,000 from the

state general fund which must be used to support the Red River valley writing project during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

**SECTION 6. STANDARDS-BASED STUDENT TESTING.** The operating expenses line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,457,010 from the state general fund which must be used to develop and administer student tests aligned with the state content standards, to report the results of the tests, and to provide technical assistance to districts in interpreting the results of the tests during the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2003.

**SECTION 7. COMPENSATION PAYMENTS TO TEACHERS AT STATE INSTITUTIONS.** In addition to amounts otherwise appropriated for salary increases for teachers at the division of independent study, the school for the deaf, and the school for the blind, the amounts appropriated for salaries and wages in subdivisions 1, 3, and 4 of section 1 of this Act include the following general fund amounts which must be used to increase teacher compensation by \$1,750 per year the first year of the biennium and by an additional \$1,750 per year the second year of the biennium:

Division of independent study	\$95,550

School for the blind	\$73,763"

1 The House version of House Bill No. 1013 included a general fund appropriation of \$1,289,643 for developing and administering standards-based assessments, as required for the state to be eligible to continue receiving federal Title I funding. The Department of Public Instruction currently estimates that the cost of developing and administering the assessments, reporting the results, and providing technical assistance to districts, as required by House Bill No. 1293, will be \$1,457,010, which is \$167,367 more than the amount included in the House version. The Senate amendment increases the operating expenses line item by \$167,367.

2 House Bill No. 1321 changes the distribution formula for limited English proficiency payments. Based on the estimated number of qualifying students, the department has indicated that approximately \$800,000 will be required to fully fund the statutory payment formula for the 2001-03 biennium. The Senate amendment increases the appropriation for the payments from \$450,000 to \$650,000.

3 North Dakota Century Code Section 15-40.1-07.8 provides a formula for the distribution of supplemental payments to school districts. The formula limits the amount each district qualifies for and does not provide a mechanism to allow the distribution of any remaining funds. For the 1999-2001 biennium, the department estimates that \$420,838 will remain unspent and will be general fund turnback. For the 2001-03 biennium, the department estimates that the statutory formula will only allow the distribution of approximately \$2.2 million. The House amended Section 15-40.1-07.8 to allow the department to adjust the formula to distribute all supplemental payment funds appropriated for the 1999-2001 biennium and future bienniums. The Senate amendment removes this statutory change and reduces the appropriation accordingly.

4 The Senate amendment removes \$50,000 added by the House for geographic education, reducing the line item to \$50,000, as included in the Schafer and Hoeven budget recommendations.

5 The Schafer and Hoeven budget recommendations included \$33,000 for the teacher certification program to pay the \$2,300 per teacher application fee for up to 10 teachers seeking national board certification and to pay \$1,000 one-time stipends to teachers who receive certification. The House reduced the funding to \$20,000, which is the same as the amount appropriated for the 1999-2001 biennium. The Senate version will allow payment of the application fee for up to 10 teachers but does not include funding for one-time stipends. The House version also allowed the Education Standards and Practices Board to spend up to \$7,000 of the 1999-2001 appropriation for the payment of stipends. The Senate amendment removes this authority, resulting in additional general fund turnback of that amount.

6 The Senate amendment increases the salaries and wages line item by \$95,550 to provide additional compensation payments of \$1,750 per year for teachers at the Division of Independent Study. House Bill No. 1344, which provides a formula for the distribution of teacher compensation payments to public schools, does not include additional compensation for teachers at state institutions.
