

JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE - SPECIAL SESSION

Fifty-eighth Legislative Assembly

Bismarck, May 6, 2003

The House convened at 9:00 a.m., with Speaker Wentz presiding.

The prayer was offered by Rep. Mary Ekstrom, District 11.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representative Solberg.

A quorum was declared by the Speaker.

REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE

HB 1505: Appropriations Committee (Rep. Svedjan, Chairman) recommends **AMENDMENTS AS FOLLOWS** and when so amended, recommends **DO PASS** (16 YEAS, 7 NAYS, 0 ABSENT AND NOT VOTING). HB 1505 was placed on the Sixth order on the calendar.

The information technology department may receive any funding relating to the purchase of information technology services under this section, which is hereby appropriated. Each agency is entitled to receive from the information technology department the equivalent in services that would have been performed by employees in the transferred positions at a cost not exceeding the amounts transferred to the agency's information technology services account."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

This amendment:

- Amends Section 10 of the bill relating to the transfer of state agency information technology positions to remove the provision allowing an agency to retain any of the identified positions provided that funding is available from internal savings and to include language requiring agencies to establish an information technology services line item.
- Amends Section 16 of the bill relating to the required information technology services to remove the legislative branch from the excluded entities, to clarify that the Information Technology Department is responsible for establishment of a consolidated delivery system, and to clarify the policies and guidelines to be established for the delivery of consolidated services.
- Amends Section 20 of the bill to provide that the Information Technology Department and the Office of Management and Budget shall establish information technology standards and to provide that the state Information Technology Advisory Committee shall review instead of approve the standards.
- Amends the effective date of the bill and removes the emergency clause. The enterprise resource planning line item and Sections 4, 5, and 13 become effective May 16, 2003.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

This amendment adds a section to the bill providing a \$5.2 million special funds appropriation from the student loan trust fund to the North Dakota University System for a campus operations pool to be allocated to higher education institutions to reduce tuition increases.
