Sparb Collins, Executive Director NDPERS, appeared in support of HB 1073. Written testimony was provided, it was read verbatim, see appendix I. Mr. Collins stating that HB 1073 is related to the OASIS Retirement plan administered by PERS. This plan has three remaining survivors.

Chairman Holmberg: What is the typical benefit per month?

Mr. Collins: Right now it is about \$700 per month, this bill would increase it by \$20 per month. Questions were asked regarding what the qualifiers career was, and why they qualify. Mr. Sparb stated that it was for state employees, prior to PERS system.

TESTIMONY OF SPARB COLLINS ON HOUSE BILL 1073

Mr. Chairman, members of the committee, good morning. My name is Sparb Collins and I am Executive Director of the North Dakota Public Employees Retirement System or PERS. I appear before you today on behalf of the PERS Board and in support of this bill.

HB 1073 related to the OASIS Retirement plan administered by PERS. This plan has 3 remaining survivors. The bill does the following:

- Increases the monthly benefits provided by \$26.66 each month for the next two years (2005 and 2006); and
- Requests a specific dollar amount of funding for the Plan to pay the present level of benefits and the proposed higher level of benefits.

Section 1 of the bill increases the benefit by \$26.66 per month per year (please note since the remaining members are survivors, they will get 75% of the increase or \$20 per month). This continues the history of providing benefit enhancements to members of this system similar to previous years as identified in the following table:

1967 and 1969 -\$10 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1971 and 1973 - \$30 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1975 and 1977 - \$10 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1979 - 1984 - \$10 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1985 - 1996 - \$20 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1997 and 1998 - \$133.33 increase per month for each year of the biennium
1999 and 2000 - \$66.66 increase per month for each year of the biennium
2001 and 2002 - \$26.66 increase per month for each year of the biennium

2003 and 2004 - \$26.66 increase per month for each year of the biennium

Section 2 of the bill appropriates \$19,000 from the general fund to pay benefits for 2005-2007 including the increase.

Also attached is a proposed amendment to this bill. The amendment would deposit the requested appropriation directly into the OASIS fund to pay benefits. As presently drafted the appropriation would come to PERS and we would deposit into the fund. After reviewing this closer we feel it is more direct to just appropriate it to the OASIS fund.

The provisions of this bill have been reviewed by the PERS actuary. The actuary determined that level of benefit is appropriate as long as additional funding is provided. These provisions have also been reviewed by the Legislative Employee Benefits Committee and given a favorable recommendation. The fiscal note for this bill indicates a fiscal effect of \$19,000 which includes \$2,160 to fund the benefit increase and \$16,840 to pay for the continuation of the present level of benefits for the 3 remaining members of this retirement plan. On behalf of the PERS Board I would request your favorable consideration of this bill. Mr. Chairman this concludes my testimony.

HB 1073 related to the OASIS Retirement plan administered by PERS. This plan has 3 remaining survivors. The bill does the following:

- Requests a specific dollar amount of funding for the Plan to pay the present level of benefits and the proposed higher level of benefits.

This continues the history of providing benefit enhancements to members of this system similar to previous years as identified in the following table:

1967 and 1969 -\$10 increase per month for each year of the biennium

The provisions of this bill have been reviewed by the PERS actuary. The actuary determined that level of benefit is appropriate as long as additional funding is provided. These provisions have also been reviewed by the Legislative Employee Benefits Committee and given a favorable recommendation. The fiscal note for this bill indicates a fiscal effect of \$19,000 which includes \$2,160 to fund the benefit increase and \$16,840 to pay for the continuation of the present level of benefits for the 3 remaining members of this retirement plan. On behalf of the PERS Board I would request your favorable consideration of this bill. Madame Chair this concludes my testimony.
