Bill 1077 Treasures Office Testimony prepared for the Agriculture Committee

Chairman and Representatives, my name is Lawrence Hopkins and I am the Deputy Director of the State Treasurers Office. Bill 1077 is being introduced as a result of an informal recommendation by the State Auditors office which disclosed that the wording in century code does not agree with the actual implementation of how the Taylor Grazing Act funds have been distributed for at least the last decade. The law states that the Treasurers office shall distribute the funds to each school district within the counties, when in fact the funds are actually distributed to the County Treasurers who in turn distribute the funds to the school districts within their respective county.

This practice was implemented to streamline the gathering of information. The counties currently collect information relating to the average daily membership of each school district for this and other purposes. Rather than the Treasurers office also keeping and maintaining such information, the practice of distributing the funds to each county was implemented. Again, the change in language on lines 10 through 13 is being introduced to have the law reflect the procedures currently in place.

We also need to make an amendment to bill 1077. We ask that the new language that was added on lines 14 and 15 be removed. The Department of Public Instruction has informed the Treasurers Office that they do not need to be notified of the distribution calculation and therefore have requested that we remove the last sentence from this bill.
