Keith Lauer, Director of the Gaming Division of the Attorney General's Office (meter 1285) Gave Testimony - Att. #1 This is a "house keeping" bill and the original language was excessively restrictive to "site premises".

Senator Triplett asked if this has been an issue? Mr. Lauer responded to a location that closed its doors and relocated its records. We can not find any of the records. Discussed using a search warrant and the persons unwillingness to corporate. Discussion of the process of obtaining a license that the premise and the location of record could be different locations. If they get out of the business then they may not even have a location to reference any longer.

TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 1087

House Judiciary Committee January 10, 2005

My name is Keith Lauer. I am Director of the Gaming Division of the Attorney General's Office. I am testifying on behalf of the Attorney General's Office in support of House Bill No. 1087, and will describe the provisions of this bill.

- This bill does general housekeeping on subsections 2, 3, and 4 of section 53-06.1-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code entitled Authority of the attorney general.
- 2. The previous language in subsections 2, 3, and 4 of section 53-06.1-15.1 has been determined by our office to be excessively restrictive when the audit and investigative staff attempts to secure gaming related records from organizations. As a result, formal search warrants may be necessary if the records are maintained at locations other than an organization's formal sites or premises.
- The terms site or premises are unnecessary language in these subsections.
- 4. The unnecessary language may create confusion particularly when a previously licensed organization no longer has a formal site authorization from a city or county or official office location.
