Testimony on HB1088 Presented by: Hope Olson Office of Attorney General January 10, 2005

HB 1088 is a housekeeping bill which replaces the State Toxicologist's title with the Director of the Crime Laboratory. The title change in HB 1088 transfers authority from the State Toxicologist to the Director of the Crime Laboratory. The sections changed in the Century Code pertain to where the State Toxicologist's title is specifically listed. The bill will enable the crime laboratory to operate more efficiently by allowing the Director of the Crime Laboratory to delegate the State Toxicologist's responsibilities to the crime laboratory personnel if she is absent from work.
