Minutes: Chr. Nelson opened the hearing on HB 1138. Kelsh and Porter absent. Bill was read aloud.

Paul Schadewald, ND Game & Fish: (WRITTEN TESTIMONY ATTACHED)

**Chr. Nelson:** You said the area now is managed by the Bureau of Reclamation?

Schadewald: Yes, it was owned, constructed and managed by the Bureau of Reclamation and we were managing a portion of it that we no longer are. There are cabin sites out there in addition and the federal government is managing those. The second portion of that bill deals with where the interest of the game and fish fund is deposited. There were two sections of the law, one on page seven, another on page eight. One on page seven said that interest should be deposited in the Private Lands Program. I think what most of you are familiar with is the Plots Program or Hunting Access Program. Then there's another section that refers to motorboat fees and says that some fees on that account should go into the Motorboat Account. The State Auditor's saw a conflict with that. We're asking that the records to the Motorboat Account be

eliminated and keep it simple. Most of the Motorboat Account is very small and we spend more money on voting through the Private Lands Program than the interest would amount to so we're asking that all the interest go to the Private Lands Program, no exceptions. No special accounting for another small town, all interest goes into the Private Lands Habitat and Access Program. Those are the two addressed in this bill. Again, the State Auditor's asked (us) to clean up our law so that's what we're trying to do.

**Chr. Nelson:** Are there any questions? Seeing none, thank you. Is there further testimony in favor of HB 1138? Seeing none, any opposition to HB 1138? Seeing none, I'll close the hearing on HB 1138.

**Rep. DeKrey:** I'll move Do Pass on HB 1138.

Rep. Drovdal: I'll second that motion.

Chr. Nelson: Do Pass Motion by Rep. DeKrey; second by Rep. Drovdal. Any committee discussion on this bill? Seeing none, I'll ask the clerk to call the roll on a Do Pass motion.

Senator Ben Tollefson, Vice Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee brought the committee meeting to order.

All members of the committee were present **Senator Stanley Lyson** who returned later after testifing at another hearing.

Senator Tollefson opened the hearing on HB 1138 relating to agreements with the bureau of reclamation for management of the Heart Butte area and deposit of interest income in the game and fish department private land habitat and access improvement fund.

Paul Schadewald, Chief of Administrative Services of the North Dakota State Game and Fish Department introduced HB 1138. The bill was at the request of the department which was requested by the state auditor. (See attached testimony).

Senator John Traynor commented that US Senator Conrad is attempting passage of a bill that will create a fund that will match state funds for the private plots program.

### North Dakota Game and Fish Department Testimony for HB 1138 January 13, 2005

The first part of House Bill 1138 deletes an outdated and unused law that set up a special account for the Heart Butte area. This subsection of NDCC 20.1-02-05 has not been used for about fifteen years and the State Auditors office has recommended that we get this repealed.

The second section of the bill is also the result of a State Auditor's Office recommendation. This amendment removes conflicting wording in the law. NDCC 20.1-02-16.1(Page 7) states that all money derived from the investment of the game and fish fund must be credited to the game and fish department Private Land Habitat and Access Improvement Fund. This conflicts with NDCC 20.1-02-16.5(Page 8) where interest on the motorboat programs and safety account is to be used for boating related programs. The solution in this bill is to require that all interest on game and fish money go into the Private Land Habitat and Access Improvement Fund. There is no need to have interest income go anywhere else. The Save Our Lakes Program receives about \$400,000 per biennium from the Private Land Habitat Program, so boaters get a fair share of the interest revenue received on Department funds.
