Chairman Flakoll opened the hearing on HB 1180, a bill relating to the raffling of livestock.

Senator Taylor was absent.

Senator Flakoll introduced the bill. The problem with the original language in the code is it requires a raffled animal to be donated. The request for this bill came through the North Dakota Winter Show who received a ruling from the Attorney General's office that the animal they wished to raffle could not be purchased but rather had to be donated.

Senator Klein said the intent last session was to allow for purchased and donated animals to be raffled but now we are making sure.

Wade Moser, North Dakota Stockmen's Association, testified in favor of the bill. (meter 316)

This makes the law clearer and is at the request of the Winter Show. Other organizations that have used this form of fund raising include the Junior Red Angus, Angus and Simmental Associations.

TESTIMONY SUPPORTING HB 1180 HOUSE AGRICULTURE COMMITTEE JANUARY 13, 2005

Good morning Chairman Nicholas and members of the House Agriculture Committee. I am Representative Ralph Metcalf from the greater District 24 representing North Dakotans living in 22 townships in Western Barnes County and 10 townships in Northwestern Ransom County.

This bill has been filed on behalf of the North Dakota Winter Show to allow them to conduct a raffle with a live animal as a main prize which they may own by purchase or donation. You can raffle most any kind of merchandise with very few limitations, but current law requires that when a live animal is raffled, it must be a donated animal. A similar bill was introduced and approved during the 2003 session but through an error the word donated was a stipulation that was left in. Actually we thought we had all bases covered as the bill was written by a lawyer in the gaming division and was reviewed by lawyers in the legislative council and was thought to allow the purchasing of animals for this purpose.

However, when the Winter Show applied for a permit to conduct the raffle, Kieth Lauer, the Director of the Gaming Division, determined that the animal must be donated. This bill before you was developed and presented to Mr. Lauer for his review on September 16th at which time it met with his approval to allow the Winter Show to raffle a purchased animal.

This authorization is necessary as the value of the animal can be well in excess of several thousand dollars and it is unlikely that an animal of this type can be secured as a donation, especially on a regular basis. However, the Winter Show committee wants it known that they are willing to accept a donation of this type in case anyone on this committee would be willing to do so.

I ask that you give this bill favorable consideration and I will try to answer any question you may have.
