Minutes: Relating to compensation of the members of the state game and fish advisory board.

11 members present, 3 absent.

Rep. Lyle Hanson-District 12- I put this bill in at the request of the advisory board of the fish and game commission to raise there salary from \$50.00 a meeting to \$62.50 which puts in lines with other committee in the state of North Dakota, it hasn't been raised for a long time. They meet twice a year, so it is an increase of about \$25.00 a person and there are eight members on the board.

Rep. Conrad: Why don't we have a blanket amount for all boards and have it in each one of these?

Rep. Hanson: I don't know.

Rep. Amerman: Can you give me an idea of what our some of there duties.

Rita Greer-Chairman of the Advisory Board for Game and Fish-For- It is regional that I represent and we have eight regions and I represent District 6. We felt that a raise in

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compensation was needed to cover the expenses of the board while we are away from out work, we feel it is necessary to continue to have a board representive of the people in our respected game and fish districts in our state. Where everyone can feel they can serve in this capacity. I was appointed to the board in 1997 and this issue has been around since then and we thought it was time to take action.

Rep. Amerman: It went from \$50.00 to \$62.50, I would like to know how we came up with \$62.50 and not why \$65.00.

Rita: Actually, I probably mentioned \$75.00 to tell you the truth, in 2002 I looked at the board and commissions they had all the different advisory boards and looked like most of them went to \$62.50, but some went to \$75.00 and I guess the work that we do is worth the \$75.00 rate, but maybe that was to much to ask. We have two meetings a year and we also have two district meetings, so we are actually paid four times a year, but it is at the disgression of our board, if we feel we need more meetings, we can call more meetings.

Rep. Froseth: Are you reimbursed mileage and meal allowance?

Rita: Yes we are.

Dean Hildebrand-Director of the North Dakota Fish and Game Department-For-In answer to Rep. Amermans question, the board has been in existence for many years, going back to the sixties, the state had divided into eight regions, four across the top and four across the bottom, so each one of those members are representing eight or nine counties and they are appointed by the Governor and it is a four year term, and they appointed for two terms. Four of those members must be hunter recreation outdoor type people and four must farmer, rancher, land owner type

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folks. We try to keep that balance. I work very close with them and the governor. These people do a maganifeent job.

Rep. Froseth: This has a fiscal note 1750 of special funds or other funds, which would presumably come out of the fish and game fund. Does this have to go to our appropritions committee. The money does come out of the fish and game fund, right.

Dean: That is correct.

Chairman Haas: We are just discussing that.

Rep. Klemin: Does that mean that the entire board goes to these meetings or just the representative from that district.?

Dean: No sir, just the reprensative from that district.

Chairman Haas: Thank you very much. Any more questions on HB 1395?

Rep. Conrad: I move a DO PASS on HB 1395.

Rep. Potter: I second the motion.

This bill increases the per diem rate for the eight members of the Game and Fish Advisory Board. They have two required public meetings in their district each year and have 2 to 4 meetings of the entire board each year.

Relating to compensation of the members of the state game and fish advisory board.

Representative Lyle Hanson - Introduced the bill - Increase the salary of state game and fish advisory board members from \$50 to \$62.50 a day to match other committees that are in the century code.

Roger Rostvet - Game and Fish Dept. - Said the amount has not changed in 20 years. They also spend a lot of time that they are never compensated for.

Senator Nelson - Asked where the 8 members live and do they pay expenses for them.

Rostvet - Replied there are 8 members divided across the state, 4 across the north, 4 across the south. They are paid a per diem plus mileage on meetings, usually 4 meetings a year.
