#### Minutes:

<u>Chairman Weisz</u> opened the hearing on HB 1416 A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-04-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the registration renewal date for certain vehicles.

Rep. Belter:(38.1) What this bill does currently for all farm trucks as well as commercial trucks that in the state are currently registered on December 31. The reason I brought this bill forward was due to the weather conditions in the winter. I thought it would be better in a different month. After introducing this bill I found out there are some problems with changing that date and so I would hope that you could hold this bill, I would appreciate that. If you do not hear from me maybe it would be best to Do Not Pass the bill.

**Rep. Weiler** (41.1) What kind of problems are you talking about?

**Rep. Belter:** You take commercial trucks that maybe a cement truck company that only uses their trucks during the construction season. When they register their trucks they may license their

truck on December 1; they may license them for 26,000 lbs. When construction season starts they may raise them to 60,000 or 80,000 pounds and pay the extra fees for that construction period. If we did this, they would not be able to do that. There are business's as well as agricultural interests that only license their vehicles for the heavy weights during that part of the year that they use them on the roads.

**Rep. Weiler** (42.8) I know had another bill in earlier about requiring just one license plate. So if we do that you would only have to put one tab on in the cold.

**Rep. Belter:** (43.1) Currently on our semi-tractors we only have to have one plate on. Although they send us two tabs; we only have to put a plate on the front of the truck.

<u>Chairman Weisz</u> (43.7) Anyone else here in support of HB 1416? Anyone here in opposition of HB 1416?

Belter, there was some issues having to do with truck commercial licensing and periods of time. It appeared there was going to be allot of resistance if we did this so he recommended we just let it drop.
