RE: HB 1429 - City and County Candidates Statement of Interests

When filing as a candidate for office, they are required to file a Statement of Interest. This bill inserts this requirement into the applicable sections of law that pertains to school district and city elections.

Section 1: On page 1, lines 8 and 9, the change establishes that a candidate for a school board position must file a statement of interest and file it with the school district's business manager.

Section 2: On page 1, lines 23 through page 2, line 1, the text being eliminated in N.D.C.C. § 16.1-09-02 is redundant with the wording in N.D.C.C. § 16.1-09-02 as found in Section 2 of this bill in lines 19 through 23.

Section 3: On page 2, lines 19 and 20, this change establishes that a candidate for a city elective office must file a statement of interest and file it with the city auditor.

RE: HB 1429 - City and School Board Candidates Statement of Interests

When filing as a candidate for office, every candidate is required to file a Statement of Interest.

This bill inserts this requirement into the applicable sections of the Century Code pertaining to school district and city elections.

By doing so, candidates for these positions will be made aware of the filing requirement within their respective chapters, 15.1-09 and 40-21, rather than potentially missing the same filing requirement that exists for all candidates in 16.1-09-02.

**Section 1**: On page 1, lines 8 and 9, the change establishes that a candidate for a school board position must file a statement of interest and file it with the school district's business manager.

**Section 2**: On page 1, lines 23 through page 2, line 1, the text being eliminated is redundant with the previous text on page 1, lines 19 through 23, and as clarified on page 2, line 2.

**Section 3**: On page 2, lines 19 and 20, this change establishes that a candidate for a city elective office must file a statement of interest and file it with the city auditor.
