<u>Section 1</u>: On page 1, lines 8 and 9, this change establishes the date of December 31 in the year before an election cycle as the date by which the counties and cities must designate the voting precincts for all elections other than for a special election.

In 2004, under present law, the 70th day precinct setting deadline before the June 8 election was March 30. Had this law been in effect, the state and counties would have had 90 extra days to design ballots for each precinct and begin initial programming on the voting equipment. This change provides valuable extra time to efficiently and accurately prepare for elections.

<u>Section 2</u>: On page 1, lines 19 through 22, the change allows a county to use one election board in a polling place where several precincts meet to vote. Under present law, a separate election board must be used for each precinct even though the voters from several precincts are voting in the same location.

On page 2, lines 13 through 31, references to "precincts" are changed to "polling places" to be consistent with the change that provides for one election board to supervise a multi-precinct polling site.

<u>Section 3</u>: On page 3, lines 12 and 13, this change provides that a poll worker must be a qualified elector within the polling place boundaries rather than from within a single precinct and allows for the staffing of the election board as changed in Section 2.

The changes in Sections 2 and 3 allow for better utilization of financial and location resources, provides for easier staffing of an election board, and increases voter convenience.

Section 1: On page 1, lines 8 and 9, this change establishes the date of December 31 in the year before an election cycle as the date by which the counties and cities must designate the voting precincts for all elections in the following year. This does not apply to special elections.

Under current law, precincts must be established 70 days prior to an election. In 2004, the 70th day before the June 8 election was March 30. Had the proposed December 31 deadline date had been in effect, the state and counties would have had 90 extra days to design ballots for each precinct and begin initial programming on the voting equipment. Especially with the implementation of new voting equipment, this change provides valuable extra time to efficiently and accurately prepare for elections.

Section 2: On page 1, lines 19 through 22, the change allows a county to use one election board in a polling place where several precincts meet to vote. Under present law, a separate election board must be used for each precinct even though the voters from several precincts are voting in the same location.

On page 2, lines 13 through 31, references to "precincts" are changed to "polling places" to be consistent with the change that provides for one election board to supervise a multi-precinct polling site.

Section 3: On page 3, lines 12 and 13, this change provides that a poll worker must be a qualified elector within one of the precincts voting at the polling place rather than from within a single precinct and allows for the staffing of the election board as changed in Section 2.

The changes in both Sections 2 and 3 above allow for better utilization of financial and location resources, provide for easier staffing of an election board, and increased voter convenience.
