Minutes: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the delivery of veterans' services by the state counties.

13 members present, 1 absent.

Chairman Haas: We will reconvene the meeting of the House and Government and Veterans Affairs Committee and will open the hearing on House Concurrent Resolution 3016.

Rep. Grande: In front of us we have House Concurrent Resolution 3016, this is the resolution this committee asked to have put together. This comes forth with the bill we dealt with from counties consolidation on the veterans service officers, seeing the disparity from some of the counties and we just felt that this would be a very good thing to keep moving.

Chairman Haas: Our there any questions for Rep. Grande? I think you are all familiar with the background. Thank you Rep. Grande. Is there additional testimony in favor of House Concurrent Resolution 3016?

Rick Ryan-Secretary for the North Dakota Administrative Committee on Veterans Affairs-

I am hear representing Mr. Rudy Jensen, who couldn't be hear today. I would really like to tell you that we really do support the bill and the committee. I would like to introduce Bob Hanson, who is the commissioner from the North Dakota Veterans Department.

Bob Hanson-Commissioner of Veternas Affairs for the State of North Dakota-Testimony

Attached- This is a great resolution and a good resolution and we really appreciate the committees introducing it and we think it is long over due and helps address many concerns, a lot of them are in the performance audit. We appreciate the positive interest that has been shown for veterans in this session and I think this is one of them, that I think everyone can work together on to resolve the concerns and the need for veterans throughout the state. There are 25 county veteran service officers in the state that make less then 600 dollars per month, there are 12 service county veteran officers that don't have e-mail addresses, from that we can assume they don't even have computer capabilities, 29 who work less then five days a week, so the interest shown by this Government and Veterans Affairs Committee and also the Senate to help our veterans this session is really appreciated. Our veteran population is growing, what has happened here is we were looking out for the older veterans, but now what we are dealing with the younger veterans ages ranging from 19 to 30 years old from all over the state. We need to make sure that we provide the best service we can and utilize the county moneys and the state moneys, we really appreciate the committee taking this on.

Rep. Kasper: I just want to thank Mr. Hanson for doing some research on my late father Auto Kasper, he was a service officer and Mr. Hanson found the information on my father and I would just publicly like to thank him and appreciate it.

Rep. Klemm: I have a question on the hand out that has to do with veteran service letter.

Bob: That was the one we got from the association of the counties, they had presented this information.

Rep. Klemm: As I understand mill levy that was allowed was 1.25 million is that the maximum?

Bob: Yes, that is the maximum.

Rep. Klemm: Sioux county levied 2.08 mills, how is that.

Bob: I am not sure how they levy that, they levy it through general mill levy, we can check it out.

Rep. Conrad: I asked the service officer from Morton County and he said it was general funds. It is how they report it.

Bob Evans-Williams County Veterans Service Officer-Secretary of the North Dakota

Veterans Coordinating Council-22 years-I have provided the service of the resident veterans for my county, but I provided services to the surrounding counties and neighboring Montana, the training I received outside of the state of North Dakota and without the semiannual training by the Department of Veterans Affairs, the veterans in my area would be left out of the VA's arena of benefits. In this day and age of computer and electronics the need for strong advocacy is more prevalent. The veteran service officer who doesn't have electronic connection with the VA and updating training is not offering the best service to his veterans. It is imperative that this proposed interim study be passed. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

Chairman Haas: Thank you very much. Can you explain the 1.98 mills in Williams County.

Bob-The county does levy the SO budget and my office is supplemented out of general fund money.

Chairman Haas: So it is a matter of reporting, this might be over and above.

Bob- That is over and above the 1.98 mills.

Ron Auto-Morton County Service Officer-I would like to applaud you in this HCR 3016, because this something that has been long overdue. Electronics is on us and Morton County is the only county that is going to be electronically linked through to the VA through a computer program that the VA provides itself. We are not far away from an electronic filing system, much like the IRS uses basically for tax returns for the veterans benefits. Just a matter of time. I have the software setup already. The more modern the equipment and the better trained the service officers are the better off the veteran is.

John Jacobsen-Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the NDVCC and also a veteran-Testimony Attached.

Chairman Haas: Thank you very much. Any more testimony. Hearing is closed on HCR 3016. Committee what is your wishes.

Rep. Grande: I move a DO PASS.

Chairman Krebsbach opens hearing on **HCR 3016**

Resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the delivery of veterans' services by the state and counties.

(meter #4767)

Bob Hanson - Dept of Veterans Affairs - He explained the resolution and told of county service officers, how many there are, full time, part time. He would like to see more training for service officers. This is how to best maximize the resources of the county and the state. He said this resolution would fall right into place with the performance audit that was done.

Senator Brown - Asked why some counties are only part time.

Hanson - Said it depends on what the counties levy. As of 2003 there were over 25 people that made less than \$600 a month. They have their offices in their homes or businesses. He thinks this is not right. He said the counties need to step up if they want to really utilize the benefits that veterans can provide to the county. About 140 million dollars a year was spread over the state by veterans.

Rep. Grande - Introduced the bill - Said that because the House heard of the different bills dealing with Veterans services, they found discrepancies and problems so they felt that this would pull all those issues together.

Bob Evans - Williams County Veterans Service Officer - Sec. Of Veterans Coordinating Council- In support of this resolution. He feels there needs to be more training and that they will be seeing a lot more veterans because of the recent war.

John Jacobson - Legislative Committee of the Veterans Coordinating Council - In support of this bill.

Senator Syverson - Asked for a re-cap of what was being addressed in this bill.

Hanson - Replied that during the audit it was determined that county service officers need to be working together more. Need to maximize the state and county's resources.

Senator Syverson - Said, you are trying to get a clearer picture and bring it all together.
