Chairman Haas: Thank you, any questions for Donald?

Rep. Meier: Can you explain to us what the Enterprise Architecture Committee is?

Donald: The Enterprise Architecture process is the process set up by primarily by ITD, but coordination with other state agencies as well. They are a mid-level committee, it is made up of one ITD representative, and representatives from many state agencies and this is the committee that is responsible for taking standards as they come up and matching them to businesses that the agencies do and then making sure that standard fits with the business is going and that there is nothing in there conflict with what agency do on a day to day basis.

Rep. Meier: This committee is actually connected with ITD.

Donald: It sort of is, ITD is primarily responsible for creating this, however there is only one ITD representative on it with voting rights, there are about nine or ten members on there, the majority of the members are state agencies, so it has its place next to ITD. ITD has there responsibilities for making the ITD standards or at least the CIO does, however he uses his committee to advise him.

Chairman Haas: Any further questions for Donald? Thank you very much. Is there additional testimony in favor of SB 2071? Is there opposition testimony to SB 2071. If not the chair will declare the hearing closed on SB 2071.

Testimony – Presented by Donald LaFleur
Information Systems Audit Manager

Chairman Krebsbach, members of the committee, my name is Donald LaFleur. I am here to testify in support of Senate Bill No. 2071.

This bill amends subsection 5 of section 54-10-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, and will direct us to report the findings of Information Systems compliance reviews to the State Information Technology Advisory Committee, instead of the Enterprise Architecture Committee.

The intention of this section was to report the findings of the compliance reviews to the committee responsible for approving the technology standards. The State Information Technology Advisory Committee is the committee primarily responsible for final approval of the technology standards and should be the committee we report to, in addition to the Legislative Information Technology Committee.

I urge your favorable consideration of this bill and I will answer any questions you have regarding this bill.
