Chairman Lee opened the hearing on SB 2073.

Chairman Lee welcomed all member of the committee and each person in the room introduced themselves.

Tom Tupa, lobbyist representing the Board of Clinical Laboratory Practice.

Tupa: I was supposed to have people here from the Health Department to help answer any questions, however, they haven't arrived yet.

Chairman Lee: Define phlebotomy. It's the process of drawing blood from your arm?

Tupa: It's the process of drawing blood, period. And with various screenings happening at pharmacies and bedsides, there isn't a concise definition and the Board needs to adjust them time to time.

Chairman Lee: I'm passing around 43-48-03 of the NDCC so everyone can see the context of the original bill. I have a grammatical question; the phrase at the end, "who is supervised by an individual licensed by the board," when it's placed where it is it looks like it's modifies "the board." Seems to me it should say, "an individual who is supervised by an individual licensed by the board performing tests and using methods identified by rule adopted by the board.

Tupa: This language was developed by the Board's legal council, but I can take it back to him and get back with you today.

Sen. Warner: Does the simple use of a lancet (a finger puncture) require a license? We're only talking about the use of a needle.

Tupa: No, a finger puncture doesn't require a license.

Sen. Warner: So we'll still have the surgical procedure of phlebotomy being done by licensed people?

Tupa: The individual who would be doing the procedure, if they are supervised by someone who is licensed under the licensure of the Board, would be protected. But people who do home testing, i.e., diabetics or some pharmacists also do testing come under the exceptions. Those do not come under the jurisdiction of the Board. But most lab facilities in clinics and hospitals would come under the jurisdiction of the Board.

Sen. Warner: I guess I'm still looking at the distinction between finger pricking with a lancet and surgically opening a vein with a needle.

Chairman Lee: Well you don't have to have a license to do a vena puncture either, you just have to be supervised by someone who is licensed.

Tupa: That would be my understanding as well, however, I'm not the specialist in this area, we only do administrative work. Bruce Prichard is the expert. He and another staff member are scheduled to be here, but have not yet arrived.

Tupa: Mr. Prichard has just arrived, so may he answer your question now?

Chairman Lee: We'll look at SB 2073, Sen. Warner would you like to ask your question?

Sen. Warner: I'm unsure as to the licensure of a phelbotomist. Is there an actual physical license issued to a person which allows them to do phlebotomy?

Bruce Prichard, Board of Clinical Laboratory Practices: There is no licensing of phelbotomist in this state right now.

Chairman Lee: So as long as they're under the supervision of someone who is a registered phelbotomist; in other words, as long as they are trained by a registered phelbotomist or pathologist at the laboratory or clinic in which they work, they may have someone who is trained to do phelbotomy.

Prichard: I don't think that's required, but it is how it works. Those labs and clinics hire people and train them according to how they (clinical staff) were trained. But there is no law that says a qualified person has to train a phelbotomist.

Minutes:

Chairman Price opened the discussion on SB 2073.

Rep. Porter: I looked into the current code and there is an exemption. This subsection relates to exemptions from this act. In the exemption phlebotomy is currently exempted. In talking with the board, it was my feeling and Rep. Devlin's feeling that it should remain in the code. There may be a situation, where a secretary at the front desk, would also be trained in phlebotomy, but the actual test would be performed by the Dr. the nurse that works in the office. If this bill were to pass and there were no individual licensed by the board working there, then only the individuals who have a different license, would be able to perform those duties. The phlebotomist would no longer be able to part of their job. With the amendment, we kept number 6, in sub section 6, saying that they can perform those procedures. We removed the portion about "and beside screening tests". That test are really the only test left that left that is blood glucose test done by a quick machine type situation. We added a new piece to that exemption,

that is someone who is supervised by an individual that is licensed by the board and performing tests using methods by rules adopted by the board. That allows someone licensed by the board, a phlebotomist to get additional training to run some tests as long as they are supervised by someone licensed by the board. A phlebotomist doing just blood draws are exempt from this chapter. The way the amendment reads and there is a piece added that if they are supervised, that there is a method for them to actually increase their duties under this part, according to the rules of the board. With that I would move the amendment.

Rep. Devlin: Second.

Rep. Sandvig: When I contacted my clinic, they indicated that they train people to draw blood. Would this cover them, am I right?

Rep. Porter: The function of phlebotomy, by adopting the amendment, will not affect them at all. If you don't adopt the amendment, the function of phlebotomy, kind of goes away. Because the exemption goes away.

Chairman Price: In Section 1, they still will be able to draw, do the tests, if they are supervised by a person who is licensed. And section 2 does what?

Rep. Porter: Yes that is right, and Sub section 6, they can do expanded things as long as they are licensed by the board.

Madame Chair and members of the committee, my name is Tom Tupa and I am representing the ND Board of Clinical Laboratory Practice. I am here in favor of the SB2073 which was requested by the Board.

Currently, the law exempts from licensure, "phlebotomy personnel performing phlebotomy (blood drawing) procedures and bedside screening tests".

Given the language, the nature of medical technology, and what constitutes "bedside screening tests", the Clinical Lab Board frequently gets questions about who is actually exempt from the law. The Board believes they need to get more specific and may have to list various screening tests that can change from time to time.

They felt this could better be addressed by eliminating the language on lines 6 and 7 and replacing it with language that would permit them to deal with the issue through the rules and regulation process.

This bill will neither bring more individuals under regulation nor will it eliminate any individuals currently under licensure. It will simply allow the board to more easily deal with the exemption questions through the rules process.

Madame Chair and members of the committee, I will try to respond to any questions you may have.
