Chairman Carlisle opened the Hearing on SB 2087 concerning the transfer of capitol security from the Office of Management and Budget to the N.D. Highway Patrol. Colo. Bryan Klipfel, Superintendent North Dakota Highway Patrol, read his testimony in support in support of SB 2087 (See Handout #1).

Rep. Timm asked if the keys the legislators use will continue to be controlled by Legislative Council and **Colo. Klipfel** confirmed and said the main function of the Highway Patrol will be to monitor. If there are problems, they will be dealt with individually.

Rep. Thoreson mentioned with regard to security in general that a recent visitor from Tel Aviv, Israel, was surprised that post 9/11 the building has so little security. **Colo. Klipfel** said that is an issue and he noted that we enjoy an open legislature. **Rep. Thoreson** went on to tell the committee that the Cass County Court House has scanning equipment and everything is searched.

Colo. Klipfel said the same is true of any government agency in Washington D.C. So far, in Bismarck there have been few problems. Rep. Thoreson observed we are still a people's legislature and Colo. Klipfel said the Agency would like to keep it that way.

Rep. Timm asked about the amount of the appropriation and **Mr. Joe Morrissette** said \$400,000, which is included in the Highway Patrol budget.

Rep. Timm moved to amend SB 2087 to suspend the administrative process for the issue and return of keys; **Rep. Thoreson** seconded. Hearing no further discussion, **Chairman Carlisle** called for Roll Call Vote #1. Motion passed 6-0-0.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman opened the discussion on SB2087.

Rep. Blair Thoreson explained that this bill transfers the function of security for the capitol complex from OMB to the highway patrol and there is an amendment #0201. The amendment deals with the language on page 2. There was a security assessment of the capitol complex done in 2004 and it was recommended at that time that all the security functions should be combined under the jurisdiction of the highway patrol. One of the responsibilities is to oversee the issuance's of the card keys that provide access to the building, with the only exception being the legislative council who oversees the card keys of the legislative assembly members. Because of the changes in security the highway patrol asked to be excluded from the rule making procedures regarding the issuance's of keys. The amendment here would allow the highway patrol to decide the manner in which the issuance of keys for the capitol building is accomplished.

Rep. Blair Thoreson moved to adopt amendment #0201 to SB2087

Rep. Francis J. Wald asked if there was a comprehensive plan to protect state offices and the capitol building.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman answered there are plans for converting parking to a grassed in mall and this just part of the comprehensive plan in place.

Rep. Ron Carlisle commented on the elaborate security system in the complex which you can tour.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman commented that the security is rather comprehensive here **Rep. David Monson** asked what effect this bill has as far as the security because the highway patrol already has a part in this, so is it merely a change in budgets

Rep. Ron Carlisle answered that this was correct.

Rep. James Kerzman asked how we would handle the funding for the Highway Patrol when we get to that since we are expanding their duties. Is the general funding going to change.

Rep. Blair Thoreson answered that the general funds for this would be transferred from OMB with this bill.

Rep. Bob Skarphol asked that if anyone did ask for a tour of the security system that they keep the request at a low key level so our security is not on display for everyone.

Rep. Mike Timm, Vice Chairman commented that the highway patrol budget already shows this transfer of \$438,000 and 4 FTE's for this transfer of security responsibilities.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman called for a roll call vote on the Do Pass As Amended motion for SB2087. Motion carried with a vote of 21 yeas, 0 neas and 2 absences. Rep Thoreson will carry the bill to the house floor.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the House Government Operations Committee. My name is Bryan Klipfel and I am Superintendent of the North Dakota Highway Patrol.

In April 2004, the NDHP contracted with The Wackenhut Corporation to conduct a security assessment at the State Capitol Complex. The objective of the security assessment was identification of threat and the vulnerabilities that exist at the State Capitol Complex. Funding for the security assessment and planned upgrades and enhancements to security equipment was made available through a federal grant from Homeland Security.

One recommendation was to combine security functions under the jurisdiction of one agency with that agency being the NDHP. It was recommended that an NDHP supervisor be designated to oversee security responsibilities and personnel. On October 25, 2004, Highway Patrol Sergeant Pedro Armendariz was reassigned as the Director of Security at the State Capitol.

One of the security responsibilities of the NDHP under this change was to oversee the issuance of keys to access the Capitol. Under this proposal, the NDHP would monitor who were issued keys to access the Capitol.

Facility Management would retain ownership and maintenance responsibilities for locks, doors, and software to regulate access to the Capitol.

I would like to propose that SB 2087 be amended to exclude from the administrative rules process the issuance and return of keys.
