Senator Fairfield asked if changing all the forms would have a cost to it?

Al Jaeger said the forms can be changed very easily. The fact is someone from that agency has to sign it as you will see on the top of the attached form. Someone from that agency is on record regardless whether they signed it before a notary public. When there is an emergency commission meeting they are there, so there is no doubt about who is doing the requesting. For the most part the emergency commission is a process during the interim that takes care of accounting things so that government can continue to function.

Minutes: **Rep.Devlin, Chairman** opened the hearing on SB 2098, a bill for an Act to amend and renact sections 54-16-03.1 and 54-16-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to filing petitions with the emergency commission.

**Rep.Devlin, Chairman** Mr. Secretary of State you seem to have a lot of testimony for changing just one word in the bill.

Al Jaeger, Secretary of State spoke explaining the purpose of the bill. Current law requires a jurat for any request filed with the Emergency Commission. Since has not been followed and thought not necessary the bill removes the word verified in two place in these sections of the law. A copy of his prepared remarks is attached.

There being no further testimony on SB 2098, Rep.Devlin, Chairman closed the hearing. (23.5)

Rep. Ekstrom moved a 'Do Pass' motion for SB 2098. Rep. N. Johnson seconded the motion.

The motion carried on a roll call vote 9 ayes 0 nays 3 absent. Rep. Kaldor was designated to carry SB 2098 on the floor. End of record (24.5).

This bill was introduced because of a discovery made during the research that was done for a recent Attorney's General's opinion, which had been requested by the State Auditor.

This bill removes the word "verified" from two sections of the chapter in the Century Code that pertain to the Emergency Commission.

In N.D.C.C. § 1-01-42, the word verified "means sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths." In other words, according to current law, a representative of the requesting agency is supposed to swear and sign, before a Notary Public, the request form presented to the Emergency Commission.

However, during my 12 years as Secretary to the Emergency Commission, the request form has never had a place on it for a notary to sign nor did the form that I inherited from my predecessor in 1993. It is my guess that the Emergency Commission request forms have not been "verified" or notarized for many years.

Nevertheless, because a "verified" request is a requirement of state law, our attorney has now counseled that the Emergency Commission request form (copy attached) should be revised to accommodate a notarization. However, requiring a notarization (so that the request form can be verified) is an obsolete, impractical, and unnecessary bureaucratic function.

Because time has proven that it definitely is not necessary, this bill amends current law to correctly reflect the long-standing practice of not requiring requests to be verified (sworn and notarized).

RE: SB 2098 – Related to the Emergency Commission

Because of a discovery made during the research that was done for an Attorney's General's opinion dated November 4, 2004, this bill was introduced. The State Auditor had requested the opinion, which was related to agency requests approved by the Emergency Commission.

The purpose of this bill is to remove the word "verified" from two sections of Chapter 54-16 of the Century Code (this chapter pertains to the Emergency Commission).

In N.D.C.C. § 1-01-42, the word verified "means sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths." In other words, according to current law, a representative of the requesting agency is supposed to appear before a Notary Public and execute a jurat\* on the request form presented to the Emergency Commission.

However, during my 12 years as Secretary to the Emergency Commission, the request form has never had a space for a notary to sign and neither did the form that I inherited in 1993 from my predecessor. It is my guess that the Emergency Commission request forms have not been "verified" or notarized for many years.

The request form (copy attached) currently in use does have a space for the signature of an authorized person from the requesting agency. The purpose of this signature is to authenticate the request.

Nevertheless, because a "verified" request is a requirement of state law, our attorney has appropriately counseled that the request form submitted to the Emergency Commission should be revised to accommodate a notarization in order to meet the "verified" requirement in Chapter 54-16. Requiring a notarization, however, is an obsolete, impractical, and unnecessary bureaucratic function.

Because time has proven that a "verified" request is not necessary, this bill amends current law to match the long-standing practice of not requiring requests to be verified. That is, sworn to and notarized.

<sup>\*</sup> A jurat is the authentication of a signature made under an oath or affirmation and is administered to a document signer when the signer is required to make a sworn statement about certain facts. The signer personally appears before the notary to swear (affirm) that the information contained in the document is true.
