Chairman Flakoll opened the hearing on SB 2340, a bill relating to the North Dakota racing commission. All members were present.

Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem testified in favor of the bill. This is an issue that has been around the legislature for a long time. He explained how this agency ended up in his office. The Racing Commission was started in the Secretary of State's Office, it may have been in the Governor's Office for a time and it eventually ended up in the Attorney General's office. The problem arose in connection with all the turmoil that surrounded Racing Services, Inc. and the resulting federal indictments and criminal charge and the criminal charges North Dakota has brought against Racing Services and its principles. The statute creates a terrible conflict of interest for his office. This is not a personality issue. There are 14 divisions in the Attorney General's office. In all cases, except the racing commission, the Attorney General is responsible for hiring and disciplining the staff in those divisions. The racing commission is appointed by

the Governor's Office and they then hire the director of racing. The Attorney General has no authority to direct the racing commissioner and this is not an efficient and sound way to operate government. This bill would set the racing commission up just like any other commission that is appointed by the Governor. The one exception to this is the Attorney General is responsible for regulating the simulcast racing just like they do for charitable gaming. They license it and regulate it. The commission is in charge of promoting racing. This makes good governmental sense.

Senator Flakoll asked if the bill passes, how will their status be different than the relationship with the lottery.

Mr. Stenehjem said the one exception is the powerball, they do promote the lottery. It is highly regulated, mostly by the multi state lottery commission.

Senator Flakoll said some people like to see the racing commission under the Attorney General's office so they can be highly regulated.

Mr. Stenehjem said they are highly regulated and they should be and the Attorney General's office does the regulation. They make sure the laws are strictly enforced.

Senator Urlacher asked what the outlying states are doing.

Mr. Stenehjem said most don't have simulcast racing. In Nevada the attorney general doesn't promote it, they have a gambling commission.

Dean Meyer, Racing Director, testified in favor of the bill. Mr. Stenehjem is right, this is not a clean arrangement when he is asked to investigate something that is in his own office. This would make it more transparent. He has addressed one concern with Mr. Stenehjem, he doesn't think they should have check writing ability in a two person office. There are ways to address

this concern through an independent accounting firm or OMB. This will protect the public as well as the employees of the racing commission. The racing commission is in favor of this.

They would continue to pay rent to the Attorney General's office.

Senator Flakoll asked if they are bound by law to maintain office space in the Attorney General's office.

Mr. Stenehjem said no.

Chairman Flakoll closed the hearing on SB 2340.

CHAIRMAN NICHOLAS: Committee Members, we will open on SB 2340. We have the Attorney General with us this morning.

WAYNE STENEHJEM: ATTORNEY GENERAL N. D. Thank you. I am appearing in support of SB 2340 which has to do with the state racing commission. It is an issue that more or less came up during the time that we were having problems with racing services Inc. It appears to me that we have what is not a very good arrangement from a governmental perspective on how we establish the state racing commission. I want first point this has nothing to do with Individuals and personalities. It has simply do with how the racing commission is structured In ND. The racing commission has kind of been battered around I guess from time to time. The current statue says that the racing commission is the part of the office of the Attorney General but the members of the racing commission are appointed by the Governor and the racing commission hires the racing commissioner who is then placed in my office. The

situation I have and I am not talking about any individual, I have this racing commissioner in my office who I did not hire. That I can't discipline and I can't fire even if I wanted to. That is really not a very optimal way to run an operation. Everyone else who works for me knows that they are subject to direction from the Attorney General and that is the way every other agency runs.

They employ the people the work for them. They hire them. They are subject to the rules of the agency. The duties of the racing commission is to promote racing. We regulate gambling We license them, we prosecute them. We don't promote charitable gaming. In North Dakota. That is the way it should be. I think the better approach in this matter is to simply set them aside as a separate commission just like every other commission that the governor appoints And have the governor still appoint the different groups. Like the commodity group. The one exception to that I would like to continue to audit and regulate and if necessary prosecute violations of the regulations of the state. That is what we have done in the past. The amendments that you have adds an emergency clause to the bill. The reason for that if the bill is passed would take effect probably on July first. The budget for the racing commission Currently is HB 1003 that take effect July first. It would be smart to do it now rather then the middle of the summer rather when they are in the middle of the racing season. Then having to go through that turmoil. The racing commission is currently in one of our offices here in Bismarck on ninth street. They pay rent to us. We also provide attorney services for them and they pay us for that. If we do auditing we will continue to bill them for that. That in a nut shell is it.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman opened the discussion on SB2340.

Rep Nicholas explained that this bill takes the Racing Commission and its budget out of the Attorney General's Office and the racing commission will contract back with the Attorney General's office for services as needed. The Attorney General does not have the ability to hire the Racing Commissioner and thus does not supervise or control their activities, therefore this bill will separate this commission from the Attorney General's office.

Rep. Ron Carlisle asked if this will make the Racing Commission a stand alone department

Rep Nicholas answered that the racing commission will be a stand alone agency and rent their

own office space and do their own staffing.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman asked if the Senate is making the necessary adjustments to the Attorney General's budget.

Ms Kathy Roll from the Attorney General's office answered yes.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman asked legislative council if there was anything else involved in transferring out the Racing Commission besides transferring the budget.

Ms Roxanne Woeste answered no

Rep. Francis J. Wald asked if the audit that is in process on the racing commission will continue (meter Tape #1, side B, #39.3)

Ms Kathy Roll answered that the audit would continue even if this bill passed.

Rep. Ole Aarsvold asked how the racing commission was different from the lottery.

Ms Kathy Roll answered that the lottery director is appointed by the Attorney General.

Rep. David Monson asked how the racing commission as a stand alone committee with no budget could finish out the biennium with the emergency clause on this bill.

Ms Kathy Roll answered that the budget for the racing commission would transfer with it so they would have the same budget they are working with now.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman asked legislative council if this emergency clause would be sufficient to keep the racing commission going throughout the rest of this biennium

Ms Roxanne Woeste answered that Allen Knudson would come down to answer questions

Rep. Keith Kempenich asked the racing commission would then have to come in front of the

Ms Kathy Roll answered that they would receive appropriated general funds from the

legislature so they would come before the assembly just like any other agency.

Rep. Eliot Glassheim commented that he was uneasy about taking this out of an agency that the legislature has faith in and making it a stand alone agency. Is there another way to handle this like perhaps giving the Attorney General more supervision over the racing commissioner.

Rep. Francis J. Wald asked where the racing commission would be located.

Ms Kathy Roll answered that it never did mention where this commission was located.

Rep. David Monson commented that there were a lot of unanswered questions here. Wouldn't this make more sense to do this two years from now so that there is time to make plans for this.

Ms Sandy Tabor, Deputy Attorney General, answered that things would stay the same temporarily until things were worked out. The way it stands now the Racing Commission already has it own separate budget now and their offices would remain where they are for now. Until a plan is made

Rep. Mike Timm, Vice Chairman asked what control the Attorney General presently has over the racing commission.

Ms Tabor answered that the Attorney General's office presently has very little control over the racing commission, yet the Attorney General's office is being held accountable for many things that we had no control over which makes it an impossible situation.

Rep. Bob Skarphol asked if this was an appropriated budget rather than a continuing appropriation budget

Ms Tabor answered that it was an appropriated budget.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman asked legislative council if the emergency clause is sufficient to take care of everything for the remainder of this biennium and through the next biennium for the racing commission.

Mr. Allen Knudson from legislative council answered that since this goes into effect immediately perhaps there should be some transfer authorization that the Attorney General may transfer appropriation authority to the racing commission. (meter Tape #1, side B, #51.2)

Ms Tabor commented that this would happen through the Attorney General's office once this bill is passed.

Mr. Allen Knudson answered that this would then be sufficient.

Rep. Keith Kempenich asked why there was such a rush on this

Ms Tabor answered that racing begins in June and the Attorney General's office wants a clean break from the commission before then

Rep. Keith Kempenich asked if the committee really wanted an emergency clause on this or should it be an effective date instead.

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman mentioned that he had no problem with this as long as the transfer authority is being placed in the AG's budget in the Senate.

Rep. Ron Carlisle asked if the Attorney General requested this.

Ms Tabor answered yes.

Rep. Ron Carlisle moved a Do Pass motion to SB2340.

Rep. James Kerzman seconded

Rep. Ken Svedjan, Chairman called for a roll call vote on the Do Pass motion for SB2340.

Motion carried with a vote of 15 yeas, 7 neas and 1 absence. Rep Kreidt will carry the bill to the house floor.
