Vice Chairman Erbele opened the hearing on SB 2355, a bill relating to designation of the agent for service of process for a nonresident pesticide applicator or dealer.

Senator Klein introduced the bill.

Mary Feist from the Secretary of State's office testified in favor of the bill. (written testimony) (meter 2773)

Jeff Olson, Agriculture Department, testified in favor of the bill. (written testimony) (meter 3062)

Senator Seymour asked how many years this has been designated to the Secretary of State.

Mr. Olson said since 1975.

Senator Seymour asked whose idea it was to change the process.

Mr. Olson said he hasn't shown them his amendments and he hadn't seen theirs previously but their amendments are fine with him. He has spoken with the head of the pesticide program at NDSU extension and he is fine with taking over the responsibilities.

Ms. Feist indicated the Agriculture Department amendments are fine with the secretary of state.

Vice Chairman Erbele closed the hearing on SB 2355.

Senator Taylor moved the amendments submitted from the secretary of state and Agriculture Department.

Senator Klein seconded the motion.



RE: SB 2355 – Service of Process for nonresident pesticide applicator

Before a commercial or public applicator can apply pesticides, they must first receive a commercial applicator's certificate from the Extension Service of North Dakota State University per the provisions of N.D.C.C. § 4-35-09.

As required in N.D.C.C. § 4-35-11, when a nonresident pesticide applicator seeks to be certified, they must designate the Secretary of State for service of process in the event any suit is initiated against the nonresident applicator.

Under state law, the designating of the Secretary of State for service of process for foreign or nonresident entities is done in selected situations when it pertains to entities that have a direct registration or licensing requirement with the Secretary of State. However, the Secretary of State's office has no role in the pesticide certification process.

The designating of the Secretary of State for service of process is a one-time requirement. For example, our records go back to 1975 when the designating of the Secretary of State for service of process first became law. As a result and because there is no requirement for the nonresident applicator to notify the Secretary of State of any change in their address, many of our records are outdated.

On the other hand, the Extension Service has a continuing relationship with the nonresident applicator because of the on going certification process. Therefore, they always have current data on record as to the nonresident applicator's address along with other pertinent information.

Having current information about the nonresident applicator on record in the event of service of process could be very critical in an emergency. In contrast, because of the one-time only registration requirement, it is guite possible that the information on file with the Secretary of State's office is not accurate and the service of process may not be processed as timely as the situation warrants.



This bill simply transfers the service of process designation from the Secretary of State to the Extension Service. Because they will have current information, this change will provide better protection for the public as well as maintaining the reliability of the legal process if legal action is undertaken.

Page 1, line 18, after the second period insert "Any documents filed before the effective date of this Act designating the secretary of state as agent for service of process including any written powers of attorney shall be transferred to the board on the effective date of this Act."

Testimony of Jeff Olson, Program Manager Senate Bill 2355 February 11, 2005 Senate Agriculture Committee Roosevelt Room

Chairman Flakoll and members of the Agriculture Committee, my name is Jeff Olson. I am here to testify in support of Senate Bill 2355. I will also submit amendments for your consideration.

The process that now exists is that out of state pesticide applicators must show proof of a designated resident agent from the Secretary of State before they are granted their pesticide certification from the North Dakota State University Extension Service. Senate bill 2355 proposes to name the Pesticide Control Board as the designated resident agent for out of state pesticide applicators in place of the Secretary of State. Because the Pesticide Control Board does not have full time personnel, the proposed language would be difficult to follow.

The proposed amendment would designate the North Dakota State University Extension Service or it's designee to be designated as the resident agent. This information is presently received by the NDSU Pesticide Program prior to issuing the certifications. I have discussed these amendments with the NDSU Extension Director, Duane Hauck, and Extension has agreed to be the designated resident agent. This would be a better use of the resources in administering this provision of the law.

Thank you for your consideration of this bill and the proposed amendments.
