Minutes:

Senator Stanley Lyson, Chairman of the Senate Natural Resources Committee opened the hearing on SB 2369 relating to nonresident fishing license fees.

All members of the committee were present except Senator John Traynor.

Senator Joel Heitkamp of District 26 cosponsor of SB 2369 introduced the bill stating it was developed as a result of catfish tournaments. A \$20.00 seven day license does not cover the two weekend event, but a 10 day license would make it more convenient. The 10 day license would have an increased fee and suggested the 7 day license might be eliminated.

Duaine Ash representing the North Dakota Sportsfishing Congress testified in support of SB 2369 (See attached testimony.

Mike Donahue representing the United Sportsmen of North Dakota testified in support of SB 2369 (See attached testimony).

**Senator Lyson** asked for opposing testimony, hearing non asked the North Dakota State Game and Fish Department to speak of SB 2369.

Paul Schadewald, (22.0) Chief of Administrative Services Division of the North Dakota State Game and Fish Department presented a sheet that summarized the schedule of fishing licenses. He stated that eliminating the 7 day license would be a good compromise if the 10 day license is incorporated.

Senator Lyson closed the hearing on SB 2369.

#### Tape 2, Side B, 7.6 - 8.9

Senator Stanley Lyson opened the committee work on SB 2369.

All members of the committee were present except Senator John Traynor and Senator Ben Tollefson.

Senator Joel Heitkamp made a motion to amend SB 2369 by eliminating the 7 day license.

Senator Michael Every second the motion.

Roll call #1 was taken by voice vote indicating 5 YEAS, 0 NAYS AND 2 ABSENT.

Senator Heitkamp made a motion for a Do Pass as Amended of SB 2369.

Senator Layton Freborg second the motion.

Roll call vote #2 was taken indicating 5 YEAS, 0 NAYS AND 2 ABSENT.

Senator Heitkamp will carry SB 2369.

This bill creats a new 10 day nonresident fishing license costing \$25. Currently a nonresident season long fishing license costs \$35, a 3 day license costs \$15 and a 7 day license costs \$20.

No significant change in revenue is anticipated. Sales of this new license will result in increased revenue in some situations and decreased revenue in others. These are expected balance out, resulting in no net change in revenue for the game and fish fund.

Minutes:

Chr. Jon O. Nelson: I will open the hearing on SB 2369 and ask the clerk to read the title.

Quorum present, Rep. Keiser absent.

Sen. Joel Heitkamp: This bill comes to you from friends in the Wahpeton area. Catfish fishing has gotten real big in Red River area; they will have some big catfish events going on up and down the river. The current law has two different licenses, one short term and one a little longer. The longer term license is only a seven day license. They would like to incorporate two weekends so they would have ten days to experience in ND. Most catfish tournament participants are coming up from the South, where it's a much bigger deal than what has caught on up here. This bill would raise the time to 10 days and raise the fee \$5, to \$25 to cover the two weekends. We eliminated the seven day license at the request of the Game & Fish Dept. Chr.

**Nelson:** Are there any questions?

Rep. David Drovdal: Can you tell us the fees for the three, seven and year-long license?

Rep. Mike Norland: It's on the fiscal note.

**Rep. Lyle Hanson:** What's the day limit and the cost of the license on the Minnesota side (of the Red River)?

Heitkamp: I don't know. I would yield to Game & Fish to answer that.

Hanson: If it were different, they could just as well sit on that bank as our bank.

Heitkamp: There was talk about that.

Hanson: What if they're fishing in a boat? Who determines what side of the river they're on?

Heitkamp: If you're fishing boundary water, you can have a license from either state.

Chr. Nelson: Further questions? Seeing none, thank you for your testimony. Is there further supporting testimony?

Jason DuBord, ND Wildlife Federation: We are in full support of this bill.

Chr. Nelson: When we increase days on upland game, you oppose it. When we do it on fishing, you support it. That strikes a contradiction.

**DuBord:** We feel this won't be a negative effect. Fishing pressure isn't such an issue.

Norland: This affects walleyes and trout as well. (With these extra days) you can catch 15 more walleyes. At an average of two pounds, that's 30 pounds, \$5 more for your license, what does that come to per pound, and how do you feel about that?

**DuBord:** It affects walleyes?

**Norland:** I watch Van Hook in the summertime, and there is tremendous pressure from out of state.

**DuBord:** I don't have an answer.

**Norland:** I really don't think it will make a difference.

Chr. Nelson: Further questions?

Rep. Dawn Marie Charging: The premise of the bill is specific to the Red River. As you know, it is shallow now. It is a lot of pressure in a small area.

**DuBord:** I disagree. I fish the Red River, and haven't personally seen much pressure. We didn't see it as big an issue as the pheasant and upland game (pressure).

Rep. Darrell D. Nottestad: You can go from Drayton to Grand Forks and not run into a fisherman, but step on the wrong spot on Drayton Dam...! There are spots of heavy pressure on fish.

**Dubord:** If it's o.k., Duaine Ash, the lobbyist for the ND Sportfishing Congress has testimony prepared. His father passed away yesterday, and he asked me if I would read and pass out his testimony. With your permission, I'd like to read his testimony.

Chr. Nelson: Sure, you may enter that into the record.

Jason Dubord for Duaine Ash, ND Sportfishing Congress: (Written testimony attached)

Chr. Nelson: Is there further supporting testimony? Seeing none, is there opposing testimony?

Rep. David Drovdal: Just a point of fact. This bill does eliminate the seven day license, does that include the three day license?

Chr. Nelson: Paul, would you respond to that? Does passage of this bill eliminate both the three day and the seven day license?

Paul Schadewald, ND Game & Fish: The bill eliminates the seven day license and replaces it with a ten day license. Initially, it added just another license. We pointed out to the Senate Natural Resources Committee that the list of license options was getting pretty long and complicated to handle. So they scratched the seven day license and replaced it with a ten day.

Chr. Nelson: The three day is still available.

Charging: Ask him to answer the question that Rep. Hanson had, regarding Minnesota. Was

there a fee?

Schadewald: I don't know the Minnesota license structure.

Chr. Nelson: It would be helpful if you could get that information, Paul.

Charging: It would be difficult for us to make a policy for ND if we're going to shove others off

the other river bank. We shouldn't make the change unless we fully understand.

Schadewald: We'll get the information for you.

Chr. Nelson: Thanks, Paul. With that, I'll close the hearing on SB 2369.

3/3/05 Afternoon, took action on this bill:

Chr. Nelson: Let's take up SB 2369. What's the committee's wishes?

Charging: You make somebody pay more for 10 days...

Hanson: It eliminates the seven day license.

Rep. DeKrey: I move a do pass.

Rep. Hanson: Second.

Chr. Nelson: Rep. DeKrey moves a do pass and Rep. Hanson seconds. Committee discussion.

Charging: Did we find out what Minnesota is doing?

Chr. Nelson: Minnesota is three days-\$21, or seven days-\$25, a trout stamp is \$10, and their

annual fee is \$35.

**Johnson:** But they don't have a ten-day license.

Hanson: Minnesota is 7 for \$25, and our ten-day is \$25. We have three extra days in ND.

Charging: He's talking about tournaments in communities along the Red River
