Minutes:

Chairman Trenbeath opened the hearing on SCR 4029 urging Congress and the President to provide at least \$1.8 billion for Amtrak in fiscal year 2006 to sustain and improve the national intercity passenger rail system.

John Risch (United Transportation Union) Testified in support of continued funding for Amtrak. Ridership in ND is up 7.7% last year. (See attached newspaper clipping.) It is greatly depended upon by many residents across ND who have little or no other options as far as travel. One of the concerns they do have is in the most recent budget by the White House that reduces funding for Amtrak from last years \$1.2 billion to \$360 million. That \$360 million would not go to cover any operating expense. It would only cover capital expenses primarily in the NE quarter in commuter areas. That would be very harmful to ND because we have the Empire Builder, a long distance train, that comes through ND. It is certainly not a profitable train. It needs government help just like any mass transit in the world needs government subsidies in order to operate.

Amtrak ridership up at N.D. stations

Rugby boardings up 12 percent over last year on Empire Builder route

Amtrak's Empire Builder celebrated 75 years of service this year, and the Chicago to Seattle-Portland route continues to be a popular one for the nation's rail service.

Ridership on the route was up five percent this fiscal year, according to Amtrak's recent boarding statistics. A total of 437,191 passengers took the Empire Builder this year.

Of that total, 89,319 boarded the train in North Dakota at its seven stations, including Rugby.

In fact, all seven stations had an increase in ridership numbers during fiscal year 2004. Grand Forks recorded the largest growth at 12.4 percent while

Rugby was second highest at 12 percent. There were 5,533 boardings in 2004 compared to 4,940 in 2003.

Duane Veach, Rugby Amtrak depot agent, says the rise in boardings certainly is good news for the local station, and it's a credit to area residents who use Amtrak and make a point to buy tickets locally.

Stations are located in Fargo, Grand Forks, Devils Lake, Minot, Stanley, Williston and Rugby. Minot had the most boardings at 29,511.

Growing trend

In 2003, Amtrak reported record ridership, and the increase in boardings on

the Empire Builder route this year route indicates that train travel remains an important transportation option.

The passenger rail service averted a work stoppage over a year ago and continues to battle annually for sufficient federal appropriations to keep both its short and long distance train routes operating. Amtrak has been in operation since the early 1970s and has been making regular stops in Rugby for over 30 years. The local depot is used not only by Rugby residents but also those in the region.
