**ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1460**

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to a biennial report of certain programs administered or funded by the  
3 department of human services; to provide an appropriation; and to provide an expiration date.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
6 created and enacted as follows:

7 **Biennial report on programs and services.** The department shall present a biennial  
8 report to the legislative council which provides a five-year historical analysis of the number of  
9 persons receiving services under the medical assistance program, the costs for rendering the  
10 services by program appropriations, the budget requested, the budget appropriated, and actual  
11 expenditures for each of the preceding five years. The report must include a comparison of the  
12 state's experience with that of immediate surrounding states. Using actuarial tools, the report  
13 must project estimated usage trends and budget estimates for meeting those trends for the  
14 succeeding five-year period. The legislative council may request from the department actuarial  
15 reports in a format and timeline the legislative council determines necessary to monitor  
16 program policies and legislative appropriations.

17 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the  
18 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$50,000, or so much  
19 of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds derived from federal funds or other  
20 income, the sum of \$50,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of  
21 human services for the purpose of obtaining actuarial service for developing actuarially based  
22 methodologies for setting medical assistance payment rates and developing department budget  
23 recommendations, performing and reviewing data analyses, tracking program service  
24 utilization, and determining the effectiveness of quality and cost containment initiatives in the

1 medical assistance program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30,  
2 2007.

3 **SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through June 30, 2007, and  
4 after that date is ineffective.
