Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 3, 2005

The House convened at 1:00 p.m., with Speaker Klein presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Michael Bommarito, Salvation Army, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Representatives Belter, Dosch, Keiser, Kreidt, and Wald.

A quorum was declared by the Speaker.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REP. S. KELSH: Mr. Speaker: I rise on a point of personal privilege.

Mr. Speaker and members of the Assembly. Today a pioneer in wind energy development is being laid to rest in McLean County.

Denver Rosberg, age 84, was an entrepreneur, a community leader, a passionate advocate for wind energy development in our state, and a genuine pioneer in the truest sense of the word and in the great tradition of innovative pioneers who settled here more than a century ago. Included in his list of public service activities was serving as a member of this legislative assembly in 1955.

He was among the first to have several wind turbines on his farm. In those early days, he was always helping others in North Dakota get their turbines operating. Right to the end, he attended renewable energy conferences, enthusiastically telling fascinating stories about others who shared his vision of energy independence.

He had a vision of what this state could do with our wind resource and took every opportunity to learn the newest technology and the latest incentives that states were looking at to move the industry forward. He marveled at the technical progress made in the industry, yet remained disappointed that others could not always see the vision he had.

Many who knew him believe he had the first all-electric car in North Dakota. During the early 1970's he purchased a new Ford Fairlane powered only by batteries. There were 20 batteries in the front under the hood and another 20 in the trunk. It could run from 3 to 6 hours before needing recharging and could reach speeds of up to 40 miles per hour. It didn't purr like a kitten - it made no noise at all! At night he would hook it up to the wind turbine on his farm to get it recharged. He was a true pioneer.

He used to tell his local utility - "Boys, we can do better than this" when it came to renewable energy development. He was a strong advocate for policies that enabled local farmers to be paid for supplying the power for their neighbors through the cooperative by having wind turbines on their farms. He went to his grave not seeing that concept happen, but did live to see the wind industry begin to take hold in North Dakota.

In addition to this legislative service and his activity with wind development, he cared about his community and served it well in many capacities. He was a 4-H leader, a member of the Eagles, the Elks, and the Golden Kiwanis, and the Westerners history group.

Someday this state will achieve its destiny as the premier supplier of wind energy in this country if we in the legislature have the will to develop public policy to make it happen. When that chapter of North Dakota history is written, Denver Rosberg's name should be embossed on the first page.

It is appropriate that we honor his memory today. We offer our sympathies to his wife, Delores (Dee) and his family, and thank them for sharing Denver for his public-spirited activities. My hope is that we can achieve the vision that Denver Rosberg had regarding renewable energy development in North Dakota. Thank you.
