

JOURNAL OF THE SENATE

Fifty-ninth Legislative Assembly

Bismarck, January 13, 2005

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Dalrymple presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Thomas R. Marcis, Jr., Zion Lutheran Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Trenbeath.

A quorum was declared by the President.

MOTION

SEN. CHRISTMANN MOVED that SB 2063 be returned to the Senate floor from the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee** for the purpose of withdrawal, which motion prevailed.

REQUEST

SEN. LYSON REQUESTED the unanimous consent of the Senate to withdraw SB 2063. There being no objection, it was so ordered by the President.

MOTION

SEN. CHRISTMANN MOVED that SB 2197 be returned to the Senate floor from the **Judiciary Committee** for the purpose of withdrawal, which motion prevailed.
