Before March first of each even-numbered year, each recorder shall prepare a report that specifies how the county used the county's document preservation funds during the preceding two fiscal years; how the county's use of the document preservation funds has furthered the goal of document preservation; and the county's general strategic plans for document preservation. The county reports must be submitted to the North Dakota association of counties for compilation and submittal to the legislative council before April first of each even-numbered year.

SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 3 of this Act is effective through July 31, 2009, and after that date is ineffective."
