ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1019

Introduced by

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state historical
2 society; and to provide a contingent appropriation.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this
5 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the state historical society
6 in section 3 of this Act as follows:

18 **SECTION 2. FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS OR ENHANCEMENTS INFORMATION.** The
19 amounts identified in this section represent the funding adjustments or enhancements to the
20 base funding level for the state historical society which are included in the appropriation in
21 section 3 of this Act as follows:

7 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the
8 funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
9 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
10 other income, to the state historical society for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that
11 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007, as follows:

22 **SECTION 4. REVOLVING FUND - APPROPRIATION.** All fees collected by the state
23 historical society and deposited in the revolving fund established pursuant to section 55-03-04
24 are appropriated to the state historical society for the purposes provided in chapter 55-03, for
25 the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

26 **SECTION 5. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND BEQUESTS - APPROPRIATION.** All gifts,
27 grants, devises, bequests, donations, and assignments received by the state historical society
28 and deposited with the state treasurer pursuant to section 55-01-04 are appropriated to the
29 state historical society for the purposes provided in section 55-01-04, for the biennium
30 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007.

1 **SECTION 6. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any
2 moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
3 \$35,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state historical society for the
4 purpose of constructing a monument in Roosevelt park in Minot to honor recipients of the
5 medal of honor, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2007. These
6 funds may be spent only if the state historical society receives matching funds from any source
7 for the monument after consultation and cooperation with the Minot park board, veterans,
8 veterans' groups, and other interested parties through an advisory committee appointed by the
9 director of the state historical society.
