SB 2348: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-04.2-03 and 39-04.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to funding of public transportation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Mathern, Erbele, Heitkamp and Reps. Kaldor, Kerzman, Wald introduced:

SB 2349: A BILL for an Act to provide for an office of faith-based initiatives and an advisory commission on faith-based initiatives.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

Sens. Nething, Brown, Espegard and Reps. DeKrey, Kretschmar, Pollert introduced:

SB 2350: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the construction of a new facility or remodeling of an existing facility for offenders at the James River correctional center on the state hospital campus in Jamestown; to provide for state agency and university system June 2005 payroll, paid July 2005, to be charged against the 2005-07 biennium appropriations; to provide for 2003-05 biennium general fund appropriation reductions; and to declare an emergency.

SB 2351: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 65-05-09.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to workers' compensation additional benefits for retired injured employees.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee**.

Sens. Nelson, Brown, J. Lee, Syverson and Rep. S. Kelsh introduced:

SB 2352: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 10 of section 57-02-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a property tax exemption for property of a horse racing association; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sen. Wardner and Rep. Vigesaa introduced:

SB 2353: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 44-06-02, 44-06-13, and 44-06-13.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulation of notaries public.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Government and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sen. Espegard and Rep. Keiser introduced:

SB 2354: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 50-22-01, subsection 2 of section 50-22-02, and section 50-22-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to charitable solicitations.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Klein, Taylor and Rep. Kreidt introduced:

SB 2355: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 4-35-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to designation of the agent for service of process for a nonresident pesticide applicator or dealer.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Agriculture Committee**.

Sens. Flakoll, J. Lee and Reps. Koppelman, Wieland introduced:

SB 2356: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 53-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mixed fighting style competitions; and to amend and reenact sections 53-01-02, 53-01-03, 53-01-07, and 53-01-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of mixed fighting style competitions.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Government and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sens. Taylor, Erbele, Warner and Reps. Brandenburg, Kempenich, S. Meyer introduced:

SB 2357: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 15 of section 57-02-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to nonfarm income for purposes of the farm residence property tax exemption; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

SCR 4015: A concurrent resolution commending Maury Wills on his major league baseball career and urging the Committee on Baseball Veterans of the Baseball Hall of Fame to elect Maury Wills to the Baseball Hall of Fame.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.
