FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

HB 1366: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 7 and 8 of section 20.1-03-11 and sections 20.1-08-04.1, 20.1-08-04.2, and 20.1-08-04.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to limitations for individuals convicted of certain big game hunting violations.

Was read the first time and referred to the Natural Resources Committee.

HB 1514: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-44.1-06, 54-44.1-06.1, 54-44.1-07, 54-44.1-08, and 54-44.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the executive budget, budget deadlines, and drafts of appropriation bills.

Was read the first time and referred to the Appropriations Committee.
