2. During the 2007-08 and 2008-09 school year, the education standards and practices board shall award up to five matching grants to school districts for the establishment of teacher mentoring programs. Each program must include training for one district coordinator and for as many as twenty individual mentors. Individuals being mentored must be first-year, second-year, or third-year teachers.
3. The matching grants provided for in subsection 2 may not exceed five thousand dollars per school district."

The board may issue a peace officer license or a part-time peace officer license to a tribal police officer of a federally recognized Indian tribe in this state who meets the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board and has paid the prescribed license fee if there is an agreement between the state or a political subdivision and the tribe in accordance with chapter 54-40.2 for tribal police officers to perform law enforcement services. A peace officer who is a member of a police force of a tribal government and who is licensed under this section may exercise the powers of a peace officer of this state within the exterior boundaries of the reservation in accordance with the terms and conditions of the agreement between the state or political subdivision and the tribe. The state or political subdivision is not liable for any act or omission of a tribal peace officer exercising peace officer powers authorized by this section. Nothing in this section diminishes or expands the jurisdiction of any tribe or the state."
