REMARKS OF MINORITY LEADER O'CONNELL

I want to thank all the Senators here tonight and the staff and employees who made this night possible. I want to remind everybody that all 47 of us here in the Senate were hired through the ballot box to represent the people of North Dakota. We just went through a job evaluation

and I hope the people that pay our salaries give us a good evaluation. Once again, thanks to everybody in the Senate.

MESSAGE TO THE HOUSE FROM THE SENATE (WILLIAM R. HORTON, SECRETARY) MR. SPEAKER: The Senate has passed, the emergency clause carried unchanged: HB 1040.
