

RURAL LAW ENFORCEMENT - ESTIMATED COST OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRAINING

The Public Safety Committee, at its February 20-21, 2008, meeting, requested the Legislative Council staff provide information regarding the estimated cost of providing a 16-hour first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) training course to rural law enforcement.

According to information provided by the Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, there are approximately 350 rural law enforcement officers in the state. The following schedule shows the cost estimates provided by the American Red Cross and the National Safety Council for providing a 16-hour first aid and CPR training course to the rural law enforcement officers:
