Thank you for the opportunity to address the administrative rules changes adopted by the North Dakota Board of Nursing.

The Administrative Rules Committee has asked for testimony related to the following questions:

1. Whether the rules resulted from statutory changes made by the Legislative Assembly.

Yes. SB 2260 which gave the Board of Nursing the authority to conduct criminal background checks as a condition for licensure/registration and during the course of an investigation. Other revisions were made to the Nurse Licensure Compact chapter to be consistent with the uniform requirements of the compact. Other revisions were related to consumer directed care, clean up of language in other sections and one fee increase.

2. Whether the rules are related to any federal statute or regulation.

None of the rules were as a result of a federal program.

One hundred forty individuals appeared and one made comments at the public hearing. During the comment period, one copy of written comments was received. Staff proposed the addition of the definition of Single State License as proposed by the Nurse License Compact Administrators. Also, staff suggested further clarification of 54-05-03.1-06.2 Reactivation of a license for the APRN.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT, AMEND OR REPEAL ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Board of Nursing will hold a public hearing to address proposed new, amendments or repeal of North Dakota Administrative Code title 54. The hearing will be:

January 17, 1:30 PM at the North Dakota Healthcare Association, 622 East Interstate Ave, Bismarck, North Dakota. The hearing will be held on the BTWAN and IVN system.

The proposed new, amendments or repeal of the following:: Title 54 Board of Nursing: NDAC Chapter 54-01-03 Definitions; Article 54-02 Nurse Licensure; Proposed new Chapter 54-02-12 Criminal History Record Checks for Licensure; Article 54-03.2 Standards for Nursing Education Programs; Article 54-04.1 Nursing Education Loans; Article 54-05 Standard of Practice; Article 54-07 Unlicensed Assistive Person; and new chapter 54-07-02.1 Criminal History Record Checks for Registration.

The purpose of the proposed new and amendments is to implement statutes related to limited license and criminal history record checks for licensure and registration and provide clarification to previous rules. The proposed rules and amendments is to address nurse licensure, criminal history record checks for licensure and registration, standards for nursing education, nursing education loans, standards of practice and the unlicensed assistive person. The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.

4. SUMMARY OF COMMENTS:

The proposed rules were developed in conjunction with the NDBON Nurse Practice Committee, the staff of the ND Department of Human Services which included the Managed Care, Medical Services Division and the Special Assistant Attorney General of the Board of Nursing and Legal Services of the NDDHS. The result of this collaboration is the proposed rules.

All written and oral testimony is in support of the proposed changes. AARP North Dakota provided written support of the proposed changes to NDAC Chapter 54-05-04, Standards for Delegation, and Article 54-07 Unlicensed Assistive Person. A representative of the ND Department of Human Services recommended additional language for Chapter 54-05-04 Standards for Assignment and Delegation, Section 54-05-04-01 Statement of Intent, Section 54-05-04-03 Delegation process for nursing interventions, and Article 54-07 Unlicensed Assistive Person, Section 54-05-04-04 Medicaid recipient directed care. The NDDHS suggested changes would allow for appropriate administration of the attendant care and extended personal care services in the Medicaid Waiver Programs. It is important to note that an individual under the extended person care program does not have to be competent to be served under this program. No negative comments either written or oral were received by the BON.

- 5. The approximate cost of giving public notice and holding any hearing on the rules and the approximate cost (not including staff time) of developing and adopting the rules. The approximate cost of the rule promulgation process was \$2229.
- 6. An explanation of the subject matter of the rules and the reasons for adopting these rules. The Legislature passed an amendment to NDCC 12-60-24(O) which granted to the NDBON the authority to conduct criminal background checks (CBC) as a condition for licensure/registration and during the course of an investigation. The CBC is also a requirement for continuation in the Nurse Licensure Compact. ND joined the NLC on January 1, 2004. Also adopted revisions to chapter 10 related to the uniform requirements of the compact.

Consumer directed service providers allows for unlicensed assistive person to be competency verified providing nursing interventions for individuals directing their own care or for individuals who have a legally responsible person acting on their behalf. - NDCC 50-24.1-18.1 Personal case services – Residing at home.
