

HISTORY

The 60th Legislative Assembly, in Section 11 of Senate Bill 2003, authorized the Attorney General to establish a sobriety program pilot project in one or more judicial districts of the state. The sobriety program will involve coordination among state, county, and municipal agencies.

Guidelines for Pilot Program

3 conditions of bond:

1. If a defendant is charged with a second or subsequent offense in violation of NDCC 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, a Court may condition any bond or pre-trial release that the defendant not consume any alcoholic beverages and may also order the defendant to participate in a sobriety program in which the defendant will submit to twice-per-day breath testing seven days per week through an on-site breath test, or if the defendant is eligible for electronic alcohol monitoring.

Guidelines for Pilot Program 3 conditions of bond cont.: 1. cont. The Court may also condition any bond or pre-trial release on payment of the associated costs and expenses of the sobriety program.	
Guidelines for Pilot Program 3 conditions of bond cont.: 2. The Court may also order as a condition of bond for a defendant charged with a first offense of NDCC 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance that the defendant participate in the sobriety program if in the Court's discretion, participation is appropriate.	
Guidelines for Pilot Program 3 conditions of bond cont.: 3. The Court may also order participation in the sobriety program as a condition of probation under a sentence for conviction of a violation of NDCC 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance.




