1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 61-24 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to expanding the construction contracting, bidding, and project delivery

3 system for the Red River valley water supply project.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** Two new sections to chapter 61-24 of the North Dakota Century Code are 6 created and enacted as follows:

Contracting for construction of Red River valley water supply project.

8 Notwithstanding chapter 48-01.1 or 54-44.7, or any other provision of law regarding bidding,

9 public contracting, or procurement, the district may engage a construction manager with

10 guaranteed maximum price or a single source engineering, procurement, and construction open

11 book method of project delivery to expedite construction of the Red River valley water supply

12 project. These provisions supplement other available design bid-build or construction

13 management methods otherwise authorized by law.

14 For purposes of this Act, authorized construction contracting methods are generally

15 <u>defined as follows:</u>

16 <u>1.</u> <u>Construction manager with guaranteed maximum price.</u>

17 <u>a.</u> The district may hire a construction management firm to manage all
18 preconstruction and construction processes, which include responsibility for a
19 guaranteed maximum price, cost estimating, schedule, value engineering,
20 sequencing of work, and possibly acting as general contractor during the

21 <u>construction phase, detailing the trade contractor scope of work, holding trade</u>

22 <u>contracts and subcontracts, and holding the warranty on the project and pipe.</u>

23b.There may be a separate contract between the district and a builder for24general contractor construction services, which may be entered into

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1			concurrently or sequentially with the construction management service
2			contract. Either contract may include finance services, maintenance services,
3			operation services, preconstruction services, or other related services.
4	<u>2.</u>	Sin	gle source engineering, procurement, and construction open book.
5		<u>a.</u>	The district may contract with a single source to provide engineering,
6			procurement, and construction of the Red River valley water supply project.
7			The single source must design and manage all preconstruction and
8			construction processes including the completion of identified design services,
9			schedule, value engineering, sequencing of work, acting as general contractor
10			during the construction phase, detailing the trade contractor scope of work,
11			holding trade contracts and subcontracts, and holding the warranty on the
12			project and pipe.
13		<u>b.</u>	The district has access to all income and expenditures, cost commitments,
14			fees, records, estimates, and invoices. The district may take an active role in
15			the selection of materials and contractors, although all subcontracts must be
16			directly between contractors and the engineering, procurement, and
17			construction single source. A guaranteed maximum price for the project may
18			be negotiated following open book bidding of a majority of the project
19			components.
20	District responsibilities. In selecting the construction manager with guaranteed		
21	<u>maximum p</u>	orice	or a single source engineering, procurement, and construction open book
22	system, the responsibilities of the district include:		
23	<u>1.</u>	Det	ermining in writing that the selected construction project delivery method is
24		<u>app</u>	propriate for the Red River valley water supply project and is in the best interest
25		<u>of t</u> l	he public;
26	<u>2.</u>	Res	sponsibility for preparation of all environmental documents;
27	<u>3.</u>	Res	sponsibility for acquisition of needed right of way and for provision for the
28		<u>relo</u>	cation of utilities that may be in conflict with the project; and
29	<u>4.</u>	<u>Adc</u>	opting policies for procuring the project using the chosen method of project
30		<u>deli</u>	very. The policies must encourage a competitive process, soliciting bids from
31		res	ponsible and experienced trade contractors and subcontract bidders.

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- 1 The prime construction management or single source firm selected is not required to be
- 2 registered to perform design, land surveying services, construction, construction engineering, or
- 3 inspection pursuant to state law if the subcontractor actually performing the services on behalf
- 4 of the firm is appropriately registered within the state. The selected construction management
- 5 or single source firm must provide an appropriate performance and payment bond.
