## ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2019

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

(At the request of the Governor)

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the parks and  
2 recreation department and the International Peace Garden; to provide contingent  
3 appropriations for the international music camp and marina construction; to provide for a  
4 transfer; to amend and reenact section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating  
5 to state procurement; and to declare an emergency.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

7 **SECTION 1. BASE LEVEL FUNDING INFORMATION.** The amounts identified in this  
8 section represent the base level funding component appropriated to the parks and recreation  
9 department in section 3 of this Act as follows:

22 **SECTION 4. GAME AND FISH OPERATING FUND - TRANSFER.** The sum of  
23 \$381,750, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the estimated income line  
24 item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the game and fish operating fund, or  
25 federal or other funds available to the game and fish department, and must be transferred to  
26 the parks and recreation department for maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repairs  
27 expenses relating to boat ramps at various state parks for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007,  
28 and ending June 30, 2009.

29 **SECTION 5. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - INTERNATIONAL MUSIC CAMP.**

30 The sum of \$200,000 included in the international music camp contingency line item in  
31 section 3 of this Act is from the general fund, and the sum of \$200,000 included in the

1 international music camp contingency line item in section 3 of this Act is from other funds  
2 available to the International Peace Garden. The International Peace Garden may only spend  
3 the general fund appropriation to the extent other funds become available on a dollar-for-dollar  
4 matching basis.

5 **SECTION 6. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - MARINA CONSTRUCTION.** The  
6 sum of \$6,600,000 included in the capital assets line item in section 3 of this Act includes  
7 \$1,100,000 from the game and fish operating fund and other funds available to the game and  
8 fish department and \$5,500,000 from federal funds for the construction of a marina at Fort  
9 Stevenson state park for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009. The  
10 \$1,100,000 may be used only if local matching funds of \$100,000 become available for the  
11 project. If the \$5,500,000 in federal funds is not received by March 31, 2008, \$259,750 of the  
12 game and fish funds identified in this section is appropriated to the game and fish department  
13 for boat ramp improvements at Fort Stevenson state park and Graham's Island state park.

14 **SECTION 7. CAPITAL ASSETS.** The amount in the capital assets line item in  
15 subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act includes \$125,000 from the general fund and \$108,000  
16 from insurance proceeds to be used to replace a maintenance building and other capital assets  
17 owned by the parks and recreation department that were destroyed by fire.

18 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
19 amended and reenacted as follows:

20 **54-44.4-02. Office of management and budget purchasing services.** The office of  
21 management and budget shall purchase or lease or otherwise arrange for the procurement, for  
22 all state agencies and institutions in the executive branch of state government, all materials,  
23 furniture, fixtures, printing, insurance, services, and other commodities. The International  
24 Peace Garden may participate in the procurement authorized by this section. The following  
25 commodities and services, however, are not subject to the procurement requirements of this  
26 chapter:

- 27 1. Land, buildings, space, or the rental thereof.
- 28 2. Telephone and telegraph service and electrical light and power services.
- 29 3. Public books, maps, periodicals, and technical pamphlets.
- 30 4. Department of transportation materials, equipment, and supplies in accordance  
31 with section 24-02-16.

- 1           5.    Procurements through a contract or other instrument executed by the industrial  
2                    commission under chapter 54-17.5.
- 3           6.    Services for the maintenance or servicing of equipment by the manufacturer or  
4                    authorized servicing agent of that equipment when the maintenance or servicing  
5                    can best be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service agent, or when  
6                    such a contract would otherwise be advantageous to the state.
- 7           7.    Emergency purchases the office of management and budget cannot make within  
8                    the required time and which involve public health or public safety, or when  
9                    immediate expenditures are necessary for repairs of state property to protect it  
10                   against further loss or damage, or to prevent or minimize serious disruption in state  
11                   services. Emergency purchases must be made with the level of competition  
12                   practicable under the circumstances, and a written determination of the basis for  
13                   the emergency and for the selection of the particular contractor must be included in  
14                   the contract file.
- 15          8.    Commodities and services costing less than a specified amount as determined by  
16                    written directive by the director of the office of management and budget.
- 17          9.    Specified commodities and services as determined by written directive by the  
18                    director of the office of management and budget.
- 19          10.   Employee benefit services, trust-related services, and investment management  
20                    services obtained by an agency with a fiduciary responsibility regarding those  
21                    services.

22 All purchases made by the office of management and budget or a state agency or institution to  
23 which authority to purchase has been delegated by the office of management and budget must  
24 be made in accordance with this chapter, rules adopted under this chapter, and written policies  
25 of the office of management and budget.

26           **SECTION 9. EMERGENCY.** The sum of \$233,000 in the capital assets line item in  
27 subdivision 1 of section 3 and section 7 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
