The following is our analysis of the bill draft providing mandated insurance coverage for colorectal cancer screenings.

Summary

LC# 90124.0100

relating to colorectal cancer screening mandate

Comments

In reviewing this bill we interpret the provisions to require PERS policies include colorectal cancer screening examinations and laboratory tests of asymptomatic individuals in accordance with guidelines established by the American cancer society or the American college of gastroenterology. The determination of an individual's screening risk factors would be based on the individual's physician

Actuarial Cost

Based upon the above and interpretation of the bill draft, it is estimated that an additional cost to NDPERS of \$4.04 per contract per month (spread over all contracts) for the 07/01/09-06/30/11 biennium. The estimate is based on the AMA guidelines of colonoscopy once every 10 years beginning at age 50, flexible sigmoidoscopy every 5 years beginning at age 50, double-contrast barium enema every 5 years beginning at age 50, fecal occult blood testing every year beginning at age 50. The estimate assumes that the services would be subject to current cost-sharing amounts.

Assumptions:

For colorectal screenings, BCBS assumed 75% utilization. In 2007 the amount paid for the screenings was \$1.94 pcpm, which we removed from our cost estimate. The average allowed costs in 2007 were \$1758 colonoscopy, \$530 barium enema, \$41 fecal occult, \$347 flexible sigmoidoscopy.

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Examining Trends for Colorectal Cancer Among Group Members

Purpose

The following report examines the number of occurrences and associated expenditures of colorectal cancer for the members of the NDPERS employer groups.

Methodology

- Active members enrolled in an NDPERS employer group (Group Numbers: between 12000 and 12999 or 58308) were examined to identify for services associated with a diagnosis of colorectal cancer or a colectomy, occurring between July 1, 2003 and October 15, 2008 (analysis date, used as the end date in the criteria; no run out on paid date). Analysis was further stratified into three sections based on group membership: all NDPERS employees, only non-Retirees, and Retirees only.
- Data was gathered from Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota (BCBSND) professional and institutional claims for the time period mentioned above. Dates were split into three biennium, per request:
 - July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2005
 - July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2007
 - July 1, 2007 to present day (October 15, 2008 = date of analysis)
- The following codes were based on HEDIS criteria, and identified instances of colorectal cancer and/or colectomy procedures:
 - ICD-9 Diagnosis Codes: between 153.0 and 153.9, 154.0, 154.1, 197.5, or V10.05
 - CPT-4 Codes: between 44150 and 44153, between 44155 and 44158, or between 44210 and 44212
 - ICD-9 Procedure Codes: 45.8
 - HCPCS Codes: between G0213 and G0215 or G0231



Findings

Table 1 (below) examines the number of members with a diagnosis of colorectal cancer and/or a colectomy procedure. The number of visits and the associated expenditures are also shown, and are differentiated based on biennium and group membership.
