



Mandan Refinery

The Tesoro Mandan refinery began operations in 1954, three years after crude oil was discovered in North Dakota, with an initial capacity of 30,000 barrels per day. Today, the refinery has a capacity of 60,000 barrels per day and processes primarily sweet (low sulfur) domestic crude oil, from North Dakota. The facility manufactures gasoline, diesel fuel, jet fuel, heavy fuel oils and liquefied petroleum gas. Most of the refinery's products are shipped via pipeline to eastern North Dakota and Minnesota.

Tesoro operates more than 900 miles of crude and product pipelines, transporting more than 380,000 barrels per day across our system. The largest part of this system is a 750-mile crude oil gathering and mainline system that delivers all of the Mandan refinery's crude supply. Tesoro distributes approximately 85 percent of the Mandan refinery's production through a third-party refined products pipeline system that serves various areas from Bismarck, North Dakota to Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Tesoro Mandan occupies 960 acres and is situated on the Missouri River in central North Dakota, approximately five miles west of Bismarck, in Mandan.

Employing 230 full-time workers, Mandan Refinery generates

About Tesoro Corporation


Tesoro Corporation, headquartered in San Antonio, Texas, is a Fortune 150 and a Global 500 company with approximately 5,900 employees. As a leading independent refiner and marketer of petroleum products, Tesoro, through its subsidiaries, operates seven refineries primarily in the western United States with a combined crude oil capacity of more than 660,000 barrels per day. 

Tesoro's retail marketing system includes over 900 branded retail stations, of which more than 445 are company operated under the Tesoro', Shell', Mirastar' and USA Gasoline' brands.

Tesoro's commercial marketing system includes sales of jet and marine fuels.





Environment

Tesoro's Mandan refinery has dedicated about 640 acres of its property adjacent to the refinery's process units and tank farm to serve as a natural wildlife habitat. Originally constructed in 1972 as part of an engineered wetland for treated wastewater, the area has been enhanced over the years to provide exceptional wildlife habitat. Waterfowl, wild turkeys, pheasants and the endangered Least Tern nest in the area. Deer, coyotes, foxes and badgers also live and forage within its boundaries.



Employees at the Mandan refinery have built nesting structures and planted thousands of trees, including fruit trees, to provide cover and food for the refinery's wildlife.

For this outstanding example of environmental stewardship, the Mandan refinery has received national recognition from the Nature Conservancy, the Wildlife Habitat Council and the National Wildlife Federation.

Health and Safety

Tesoro's vigilant safety programs have contributed to continuing improvement in employee safety over the past several years. This can be seen in our 45 percent reduction in the frequency-of-injury



rate since 2004. In 2006, we posted the lowest Occupational Safety and Health Administration recordable incident rate in our history.

In 2007, the Mandan refinery attained Merit status under the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's Voluntary Protection Program. The refinery was also recognized in 2006 by the National Petrochemical and Refiners Association (NPRA) with the *Gold Award*, which recognizes facilities that have reduced by 25 percent or more their

total recordable incident rate with no workplace-related fatality of an employee or non-employee during the calendar year.

The refinery also won the NPRA's Meritorious Safety Performance Award for achieving a total recordable incident rate of 1.2 or less with no workplace-related fatality of an employee or non-employee during the calendar year. NPRA also awarded the Mandan refinery with the Award for Safety Achievement: 1+ Years, recognizing it for operating one or more years without an employee lost workday case involving days away from work and without a workplace-related fatality of an employee or non-employee during the evaluation period.

Community

Tesoro and its employees partner with surrounding communities, donating not only money but also time to support local activities focused on education, environment and community vitality. The Mandan refinery and its employees, in particular, are recognized for a tradition of commitment and contributions to the communities of Mandan and Bismarck and to the state of North Dakota. This commitment is reflected by Tesoro's contributions to the Missouri Slope Areawide United Way and by the support of more than 70 volunteers, representing one-third of the refinery employees, who give countless personal volunteer hours each year to the *Golden Age Project*, which makes repairs and improvements to the homes of senior citizens. Employees also raise thousands of dollars each year to support cerebral palsy research through participation in the *Great American Bike Race*.


Among the areas that benefit and enrich North Dakota communities, Tesoro Mandan is most passionate about education and the environment. For the past 17 years, Tesoro Mandan refinery

employees have joined with Mandan and Bismarck Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts and the Mandan and Bismarck City Forestry and Parks and Recreation Departments to plant more than 300 trees and bushes in honor of Arbor Month each May.

In 2007, Tesoro awarded a \$50,000 grant to help restore native prairie areas, improve wildlife habitat, and develop educational and recreation opportunities at President Theodore Roosevelt's Elkhorn Ranch in North Dakota.





Our mission is to build strategic partnerships with the communities where we operate. At Tesoro, our community investment efforts focus on community vitality, education and the environment.



We help better the lives of people for generations to come by preserving natural resources and promoting clean surroundings.



Meals On Wheels, Big Brothers Big Sisters and Special Olympics bring hope to thousands of people—young and old—in the communities served by Tesoro. In turn, our continuing volunteer and fund-raising efforts for these signature charitable organizations bring out the best in Tesoro employees.

Meals On Wheels

Working together to alleviate hunger

Tesoro believes that no senior citizen should go hungry. Because of our concern for their welfare, Meals On Wheels was Tesoro's first company-wide sponsorship. Not only does Tesoro donate money and fuel cards to help purchase gasoline needed to make deliveries, but our employees play a vital role by personally delivering hot meals to seniors.



The company established its partnership with Meals On Wheels in 2006 with a donation of more than \$100,000 to the Meals On Wheels Association of America Foundation. The money was raised through Tesoro's donation of 2 cents for every gallon of gasoline sold at 475 retail stations over a three-day period to the Meals On Wheels program. During this campaign, Tesoro funded a public awareness campaign by Meals On Wheels to bring attention to the issue of senior hunger. Tesoro hosted live radio remotes and events in 13 markets, where employees joined in to greet customers,. pump gas, wash windshields and collect donations. In addition to the \$100,000 donation, the company also provided Meals On Wheels with more than \$28,000 worth of media exposure, promotional materials and cash donations collected at the retail sites.

Tesoro partners with local Meals On Wheels programs in 13 markets. In San Antonio, more than 90 Tesoro volunteers donate their time to deliver meals to homebound seniors every weekday. Through the San Antonio Meals On Wheels program, more than 600,000 meals are provided to seniors in the area each year.

Big Brothers Big Sisters Positive mentoring for boys and girls

Throughout the company, Tesoro employees are enthusiastic in their support of Big Brothers Big Sisters. This nationwide youth mentoring organization strives to reach more young people every day.

Tesoro San Antonio helps make this possible through major fundraisers like the Tesoro Par for Kids' Sake golf tournament. Thanks to employees, vendors and many other groups that participated in the tournament, the event raised more than \$150,000 for



Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Texas in 2006. In 2007, the tournament more than doubled the contribution, raising more than \$342,000 for the organization.

Tesoro's Anacortes refinery is an annual sponsor of Bowl for Kids' Sake, which benefits Big Brothers Big Sisters in Northwest Washington. Employees and friends join together for a great time of bowling to help provide funds for more Big Brothers and Big Sisters to be matched with children.

Special Olympics

Cheering athletes on to victory

Supporting athletes with intellectual disabilities through Special Olympics is an important priority for Tesoro and its employees. Tesoro volunteers support year-round sports training and competition opportunities for these athletes.

Among the Special Olympics events in which Tesoro actively participates:

- Tesoro's corporate headquarters sponsors the Tesoro Plane Pull for Special Olympics Texas, raising a total of approximately \$70,000 in 2006 and 2007. More than 100 Tesoro employees from around the country come together in San Antonio to participate in the fund-raiser.
- For the past two years, Tesoro Hawaii has held a fund-raising promotion called Fueling Dreams, raising a total of \$58,000 to benefit athletes competing in the Special Olympics World Summer Games in different international locations. During the 12-hour promotion, gasoline prices were dropped by at least 10 cents per gallon at 14 Tesoro stations in Hawaii, and we donated 10 cents per gallon sold to Special Olympics.
- In Hawaii, more than 100 volunteers help host the Special Olympics Hawaii Summer Games Opening Ceremony, sponsored by Tesoro for the past 10 years.



- The Golden Eagle refinery in Martinez, California annually hosts the Special Olympics Northern California Softball Regional Championships, serving more than 700 athletes and their families at the Tesoro Golden Eagle baseball fields. Tesoro presented a check for \$60,000 to Special Olympics of Northern California, and more than 60 Tesoro employees and their families volunteered to support the event.
- Tesoro's Mandan, North Dakota refinery presented Special Olympics North Dakota with a check for more than \$7,000 as the result of its Tesoro Mandan Refinery Golf Extravaganza in which 88 golfers participated.
- Tesoro's corporate headquarters is a presenting sponsor of OscarNight® America, the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences' grassroots program that enables charities to host official viewing parties as fund-raising events. In 2006, the San Antonio OscarNight event raised \$50,000 for Special Olympics.
- Tesoro's Los Angeles refinery took second place at the Special Olympics Southern California Plane Pull Challenge fund-raiser. The team of 20 competed with other groups to pull a 150,000-pound FedEx airplane 25 feet.

We value the positive impact of community involvement.

Look everywhere that Tesoro refineries are located—and beyond. Tesoro is immersed in the communities we serve, volunteering to help better the lives of residents across the board. We are involved in charity events, mentoring at schools, assisting seniors who need a hand, and giving back to our troops in the military.

Tesoro employees seek to make a meaningful difference through community outreach programs, signature programs and partnerships, and charitable donations. Many of our refineries develop their own innovative programs to meet local needs with outstanding results.

We are proud that Tesoro stands out because of efforts like these that are focused on people. The impact of such programs and events strengthens the vitality of every community we serve.

Leading the United Way charge

Tesoro employees enthusiastically and substantially support United Way. Contributions continue to rise significantly each year, and the company has increased its match of employee donations over the last two years from 50 cents to dollar for dollar. In total, Tesoro raised more than \$1.4 million company-wide in 2006 through fund-raising activities and pledge campaigns.

Local efforts included:

- Day of Caring at the Anacortes, Washington refinery, where Tesoro work crews volunteered to install ceiling tiles at a local community center for youth. Through this and other activities, Tesoro employees raised \$88,000 for United Way of Skagit County.
- In North Dakota, our Mandan refinery sponsored numerous activities, including a silent auction of items donated by employees. A leading contributor to the local United Way effort, the Mandan refinery also published and sold

- a cookbook of employees' recipes. In total, Mandan refinery employees donated more than \$69,000 to the Missouri Slope Areawide United Way.
- In Salt Lake City, Tesoro contributed more than \$133,000 in 2006 through such activities as a motorcycle team event, a used furniture sale and a challenge campaign to meet their goal—which ended successfully with Tesoro management sporting newly dyed multi-hued hair. Tesoro also donated a year's worth of Tesoro gas cards to go with the BMW provided by a local dealership for the United Way of Salt Lake's annual prize program.
- In Alaska, Tesoro's Kenai refinery sponsored its 6th Annual Tesoro Golf Tournament. More than 30 area businesses contributed to the 2006 event, 21 teams participated, and the effort raised \$15,000 for United Way. In 2006, Alaska employees donated a total of \$92,000 to the United Way of Anchorage and Kenai Peninsula United Way.

More than 90 Tesoro employees from corporate headquarters and the Anacortes, Golden Eagle, Salt Lake City and Mandan refineries participated in the Tesoro Plane Pull Challenge benefiting Special Olympics Texas.

• The Golden Eagle refinery raised more than \$230,000 in 2006 in employee contributions for United Way of the Bay Area. Employees set a refinery record with contributions totaling 40 percent more than the previous year's donations. In total with a company contribution, more than \$400,000 was donated.

In addition to extensive employee participation, Tesoro provides leadership to area-wide United Way campaigns. Tesoro Vice President Al Anderson co-chaired the Missouri Slope Areawide United Way campaign in 2006; and Tesoro Chairman, President and CEO Bruce Smith chaired the 2007 San Antonio campaign.

Tesoro's corporate headquarters was named the 2007 Corporate Volunteer of the Year by United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County. Special recognition was given to the 250-member employee volunteer program, Team Tesoro, which contributed nearly 2,500 volunteer hours to 20 events, organizations and community causes in 2006.

Continuing community commitment in Anacortes

The Anacortes refinery in Washington consistently lends its helping hands to many causes. Among the organizations they assist are Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northwest Washington, Skagit Hospice Foundation, Adopt-a-Highway, Habitat for Humanity and the Anacortes Parks Foundation. Anacortes employees demonstrate sheer dedication and endurance for the 18-hour American Cancer

Society's Relay for Life, where Team Tesoro's 18 walkers and runners recently logged 103 miles. The event raised \$80,000 for American Cancer Society.

Taking steps to make a difference

Tesoro's Auburn, Washington office is dedicated to raising funds for two important organizations: the American Heart Association and The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. Auburn office volunteers participate in the area's Annual Heart Walk, raising funds for research and programs to fight cardiovascular disease. Together, employee volunteers and Pacific Northwest Tesoro 2Go store employees raised more than \$13,200 for the organization. The Auburn office also sponsored the Links for Life golf tournament benefiting The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. The event raised \$119,000 in 2006.

Fueling the way to winter victory



Hammering out home repairs for seniors

Each spring, Mandan refinery employees volunteer countless hours to the Golden Age Project with the mission of improving the living environments of local senior citizens. The Mandan refinery, in conjunction with the United Steel Workers Union, has taken on community projects benefiting seniors in Mandan and Bismarck since 1992. The team works closely with two community outreach programs—Mandan Golden Age Services and the Bismarck Senior Center.

On board with making a difference

Tesoro's Salt Lake City refinery provides leadership through its representation on a number of boards of community-minded organizations, including United Way of Salt Lake, Junior Achievement of Utah and the Utah Safety Council. In addition, Tesoro provides support for such local community organizations as the NAACP, Toys for Tots, 4-H Clubs and the Rose Park Neighborhood Council.

Going the extra mile

Refinery and marketing employees at the Mandan refinery in North Dakota turned out in force for the 2006 Great American Bike Race for cerebral palsy. Tesoro employees joined hundreds of other local volunteers on stationary bikes amid balloons and banners at the Bismarck State College Armory to raise money for patients with cerebral palsy and their families. In its 11th year, the 2006 bike race raised a record \$170,000. Tesoro's corporate headquarters matched the Mandan refinery's donation of \$1,500, for a total contribution of \$3,000 to the organization.

Showing support for our troops


Supporting the military is a key Tesoro priority. At the Army Fisher Houses and Powless Guest House at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio. wounded soldiers are made to feel welcome and appreciated for their service to our country. Tesoro employees host Independence Day carnivals for soldiers and their families, decorate the houses for the Christmas holidays and provide hospitality and support through other volunteer activities.

Hope fulfilled by horsing around

The Children's Hope Learning Center, which serves children with special needs, benefits from the participation and support of the Mandan refinery. Employees have served on the center's Board of Directors for over 10 years. In the Catch a Painted Pony community-wide fund-raiser, Tesoro sponsors one of 30 life-sized painted ponies each year to help raise money for the center and for Easter Seals Goodwill North Dakota.

Positive programs for kids

Tesoro's Golden Eagle refinery employees serve the Boys & Girls Club of Diablo Valley through many events, including Day For Kids, where Tesoro employees volunteer to help celebrate the children who benefit from the Boys & Girls Club programs. The refinery's \$25,000 donation to the Boys & Girls Club helps provide youth with programs that encourage self-esteem, purpose and a positive attitude.



We value the impact that educational support can make on young minds.

Tesoro believes that today's students are the driving force behind tomorrow's communities. They must be given every opportunity to learn and to believe in themselves, academically and personally. If even a single student benefits from a Tesoro employee's mentoring or encouragement, it is a great accomplishment.

You will find Tesoro represented in classrooms, early childhood learning centers, colleges and other educational institutions. Many of our employees mentor, teach and raise funds, providing support that inspires students to reach greater heights. Others promote engineering careers to high schoolers, judge science fairs or read aloud to kindergartners.

At some Tesoro facilities, students have the opportunity to explore careers in the sciences by conducting experiments that involve basic concepts. Scholarships that encourage high school seniors to pursue advanced education in math and science, funded in part by Tesoro, have made it possible for students to attend college—sometimes as the first in their families to do so.

Where education is concerned, Tesoro strives to make a major impact on students in every community we serve. By partnering with schools and other community groups to promote innovative programs, we can help ensure academic success.

Bringing more value to the environment of learning.

When education becomes a major focus for businesses and nonprofit groups, the benefits to the community can be far-reaching. Tesoro employees exemplify the spirit of helping students to succeed, every chance they get. They enthusiastically take part in local initiatives and develop innovative ways to motivate students to learn and continue with higher education.

Mentoring multiplied

In just a few years, Tesoro's participation in the mentoring program at Agnes Cotton Elementary in San Antonio has grown by 150 percent. Employees find that they get more than they give when they dedicate one hour a week to help make a difference in a child's life. The mentoring program focuses on helping students in academics, as well as providing recognition for conduct and citizenship. Currently, nearly 40 Tesoro employees participate as mentors in the program. In many instances, Tesoro's commitment to the school goes beyond mentoring. Tesoro has adopted this elementary school and has pledged monetary and volunteer support to make a significant impact. At the start of the school year, Tesoro donated more than 400 backpacks full of school supplies at a back-to-school rally. Tesoro employees contributed by donating more than 13,000 school supply items. Employees have also taken part in the school's National Night Out, an event observed across the country to focus on neighborhood drug and crime prevention.


Driving student achievement

Tesoro offers a unique program aimed at encouraging academic excellence. Designed to benefit the up-and-coming next generation of Tesoro customers, our Gallons for Grades program rewards students who earn good grades with Tesoro fuelCards, good for free gasoline at participating Tesoro stations. The program first began in Alaska in 1997 and has since expanded to Hawaii, Utah, North Dakota, Idaho and Minnesota. Qualified high school and college students are awarded \$2 for each A and \$1 for each B on their report cards. Tesoro processed nearly 11,000 student report cards in the 2006 -2007 school year and awarded more than \$119,000 in gift cards to students.

A taste of academic success

Tesoro employees at the Kapolei refinery work tirelessly to support educational efforts in Hawaii. Tesoro volunteers play a major role to help put on the Taste at Kapolei scholarship fund-raiser, which in 2006 raised \$300,000 for scholarships benefiting high school seniors. Employees also participate as instructors for Leeward Community College Process Technology certification training.

Employees at the Golden Eagle refinery host local elementary school kids involved in the *Kids and* the Power of Work program, where students can visit a workplace to participate in hands-on educational activities.

Tesoro's Gallons for Grades program encourages academic excellence among high school and college students. The community rewards program provides a practical incentive for doing well in school by rewarding students with Tesoro fuelCards that are good for free gasoline at participating Tesoro stations.

Intelligent science fair support

The Hawaii State Science and Engineering Fair is the oldest and largest science education program in Hawaii. Over 6,000 students participate in the science fair program each year, with about 400 reaching the statewide event. In 2006, the program found a knowledgeable resource in Tesoro Hawaii. Kapolei refinery employees served as judges and mentors for the statewide event and also provided a safety representative to ensure that projects were conducted in a safe manner. Tesoro also provided financial awards for the winners.

An outer space dream come true

With the help of Tesoro funding, all sixth-grade students on Alaska's Kenai Peninsula were treated to a day at the Challenger Learning Center of Alaska, including a two-hour simulated spaceflight mission. As part of the Center's Starbase program, this offers the next best thing to an actual flight, right down to a mission control room that replicates the one at NASA in Houston. The event is designed to foster interest in math, science and technology.

Engineering boost for students

Tesoro employees in North Dakota look forward to the annual Engineering Week at Mandan/Bismarck high schools. During this week, Team Tesoro volunteers visit the high schools and speak to math and science students about careers in engineering. In addition, a number of students have an opportunity to shadow Tesoro engineers on the job.

The Mandan refinery also supports the United Tribes International Powwow, presented annually by the United Tribes Technical College, a nonprofit

organization that serves the academic and cultural needs of American Indian students and their families. The college provides higher education in applied sciences.

Learning to excel in Salt Lake City


As a school sponsor for the United Way program in Salt Lake City, Tesoro adopted Escalante Grade School and provided program instructors. The Salt Lake City refinery also sponsored the West High School summer internship program, and through its efforts the program was able to continue operation.

Fast reaction time

Tesoro's Salt Lake City operations enabled students at 20 Utah schools to take part in Reaction Time, a hands-on chemistry program for elementary students presented by The Children's Museum of Utah. Thanks to Tesoro's sponsorship, fifth-graders became junior scientists and conducted interactive experiments using common household substances.

The power of working with schools

Employees at Tesoro's Golden Eagle refinery serve as mentors to local elementary students through a program called Kids and the Power of Work (KAPOW). Throughout the school year, Tesoro volunteers meet for an hour at a time with students and teachers in the Mount Diablo Unified School District, providing instruction on the application of skills learned in the classroom to career opportunities in the future. More than 200 students participate in the program, finishing the year with a tour of the refinery and interacting with emergency rescue teams, shipping, medical and fire department employees.



We value the importance of preserving and protecting the sensitive environments in which we operate.

At Tesoro, we believe that a company committed to protecting natural resources has a responsibility to safeguard the environment for today and for generations to come. Environmental stewardship is particularly important because our company operates in ecosystems that are extremely sensitive. Whether it be the tropical rainforests of Hawaii, the vast northern frontiers of Alaska, the grasslands of the Dakotas or other naturally fragile regions, Tesoro is focused on responsible management of the environment.

Tesoro's environmental initiatives include waterway and highway cleanup efforts, oil spill prevention, maintaining highly effective emission control systems to reduce airborne pollutants, and outreach programs with a number of environmental groups.

Tesoro is focused on forging alliances with environmental groups in order to build and strengthen relationships so that the natural surroundings in which we operate can thrive. We believe the greater the stake Tesoro has in effecting positive change in the local environment, the more beneficial our efforts will be to the entire community.

We work nonstop to preserve and protect the water, animals, plants and other valuable elements of our environment.

Being a careful steward of our natural resources goes hand in hand with producing transportation fuels and related products that are safe for the environment. We live and work in areas that are vitally dependent on environmental protection: waterways, wildlife habitats, forests, farmland, beaches and mountains.

Tesoro is charged with being more than just a good corporate citizen operating in environmentally sensitive areas. Our company is committed to pursuing environmental initiatives that ensure sound, sustainable conditions for the long run across every community. To this end, we partner with government agencies, youth groups, environmental organizations, independent entities and community groups.

Going natural with North 40

In North Dakota, Tesoro Mandan has set aside approximately 640 acres of its property as a natural wildlife habitat. The area, situated adjacent to the refinery, also features an award-winning wastewater treatment system. Each May, Tesoro works alongside Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts from Mandan and Bismarck, and the parks and recreation departments of both cities, to plant more than 300 trees and bushes in honor of Arbor Month.

Green Team gets green light to clean up

The Salt Lake City Green Team counts the local Tesoro refinery among its membership of environmentally responsible companies. The Green Team is a citizen-based advisory committee that advises the mayor on environmental needs, assists with community outreach and hosts guest speakers on environmental issues that can affect the community.

Good works for San Antonio

Employees at Tesoro's corporate headquarters are committed to protecting the environmental quality of the community. In 2007, employees turned out for the Basura Bash, the annual cleanup of a 12-mile stretch of the San Antonio River. More than 200 tons of metal and 1,500 tires have been removed from the river banks during the 12 years that the event has been held. Recently, Tesoro employees and their families partnered with employee volunteers from AT&T to improve an often-neglected part of the river near the San Antonio Museum of Art.

Preserving the best of California

Tesoro's Golden Eagle refinery in Northern California is situated in the midst of beautiful wetlands and waterways. Our company stays current and involved in important natural resource protection matters through ongoing involvement with a number of environmentally minded organizations, including the John Muir Heritage Land Trust, Coast Guard Foundation, Maritime Foundation and Bird Rescue Center.

Tesoro funded the purchase of 15,000 trees for national forests damaged by fires and disease through the National Arbor Day Foundation's reforestation efforts. The commitment is part of a long-term effort to promote environmental stewardship, which is one of Tesoro's core values.

Recognized for advancements in oil spill prevention

Tesoro Hawaii was recognized by the Pacific States/British Columbia Oil Spill Task Force in 2006 as a recipient of its Legacy Award for Oil Spill Prevention, Preparedness and Response. Tesoro Hawaii was recognized for investments in spill prevention and response at its single point mooring operations, located 1.7 miles offshore of Barbers Point on Oahu, Hawaii, where 65 percent of all petroleum products enter the state.

The Kenai refinery in Alaska is actively engaged in the development of the Geographic Response Strategies in Alaska, and is proactive in working with the Cook Inlet Regional Citizens Advisory Council regarding training and participation in Tesoro Spill Management Team activities.

Working to protect marine life

Tesoro is partnering with the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) to develop an education and outreach campaign to support the organization's Coral Reef Conservation Fund. The purpose of the campaign is to provide grants for projects that reduce and prevent degradation of coral reefs and associated reef habitats in Hawaii.

Providing targeted marine education is one of NFWF's stated conservation strategies and is a primary goal of the Tesoro campaign as well.

Earth-aware EAGLES fly high

The Tesoro Anacortes refinery in Washington is active in the Environmental Awareness Group Learning Environmental Solutions (EAGLES) program, which focuses on environmental projects like roadside litter cleanup and Earth Day observances. Anacortes has also undertaken a number of environmental projects including construction of a state-of-the-art emission control system that can reduce sulfur dioxide emissions by 95 percent. The refinery also produces a gasoline blend designed to reduce pollution from vehicles. This product has already earned high acclaim from local regulatory agencies.

Tons of cleanup work

The Pacheco Slough Cleanup engaged the Tesoro Golden Eagle Community Advisory Panel (CAP) and local schools to fill an 11-ton container with debris removed from neighboring creeks and sloughs near the refinery. In addition, Golden Eagle employees, CAP, and local county officials partnered to further support the schools with environmental stewardship through employee science fair displays showing real-world applications within the refining industry.

Putting down roots for the environment

In early 2007, Tesoro committed to fund the purchase of 15,000 trees for national forests damaged by fires and disease. Tesoro has pledged to support the National Arbor Day Foundation's reforestation efforts as part of a long-term effort to promote environmental stewardship, which is one of Tesoro's core values.







Guidelines

Grants made in support of Tesoro's community investment fall into three main focus areas: Education, Environment and Community Vitality. In all our charitable giving activities, we pay special attention to those requests from nonprofits that address issues related to youth development and education, particularly for low-income and minority populations, intellectually disabled youth and adults and the elderly.

We encourage nonprofit applicants to carefully review the requirements and limitations outlined in the Tesoro Charitable Contribution Guidelines found on our Web site, www.tsocorp.com, to ensure eligibility before completing and submitting the application. This application can also be downloaded from the Web site.

Limitations

To further clarify the Tesoro review process, we have instituted the following limitations. These limitations govern our charitable contributions.

We do not support the following:

- Nonprofit organizations that do not hold 501(c)(3) tax-deductible status under the Internal Revenue Code
- Research programs
- Government agencies
- Individuals
- Travel, either by group or individuals
- Sporting events
- Meetings, conferences or seminars
- Advertising or marketing sponsorships
- Capital projects
- Religious organizations
- Political groups

Dates and Deadlines

Proposal review is ongoing, from January 1 through December 31 of each year.

Application Procedures

Eligible nonprofits must complete the Tesoro Charitable Contribution Application and submit it with all required attachments. We will review only those proposals that completely meet the requirements. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed or returned. We submit our decision in writing regarding complete proposals. We typically outline the terms of payments in a letter, along with any requirements for evaluation and final reporting.

Tesoro reserves the right to target its resources to certain geographic areas, program categories and projects.
