Industry, Business and Labor Interim Committee August 21, 2008

Chairman Berg, members of the Industry, Business and Labor Interim Committee, I am Arnold Thomas, President of the North Dakota Healthcare Association.

The NDHA sees no public benefit rationale supporting limited ownership of commercial pharmacies in ND.

- There is no evidence or indication that the public is at greater risk receiving commercial pharmacy services in a non-pharmacist owned setting such as a hospital, than in a pharmacy owned setting, such as White Drug.
- ➤ We see no limitation upon the Board to regulate pharmacists, regardless of their earning status, or pharmacies, regardless of their ownership status.
- There is no evidence or indication that a non-pharmacist owned pharmacy cannot compete on service or price, or reduces consumer choice.
- Licensure by tele-pharmacy site of service fails to address the different delivery arrangements of clinical and medical services by integrated health care organizations.

Recommendations:

- 1. The statutory restrictions on pharmacy ownership be repealed
- 2. The licensure fee of pharmacists and pharmacies is sufficient to support the regulatory functions of the Board of Pharmacy.
- 3. The composition of the Board of Pharmacy includes geographical, constituency and consumer representation.
- 4. A separate license should not be required for each tele-pharmacy site.
