Cellphone Use is Booming Nationwide: 2006 Stats

- 219.4 million users, up 38.9 million over 2004
- Annual wireless revenue: \$121 billion
- 1.7 trillion minutes of use compared to 29 billion 12 years ago
- Average bill = \$50.64 (2004) (in 1987 it was \$154.62, inflation adjusted)
- Cost/minute: \$1 − 20 years ago. 7¢ today
- More than 240,000 E911 calls per day

PSC Jurisdiction Over Wireless

- Limited
- Federal Government Prevents states from oversight of rates or "market entry."
- PSC grants "ETC Status" which gives telecom carriers federal subsidies, but this does not give PSC authority to order towers to be built.

Connecting Consumers


- Help consumers find answers to questions/concerns about their wireless service




Population per Sq Mile by County 3 Boissevain
