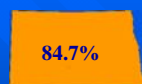

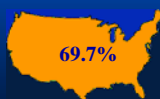

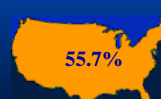

or Higher



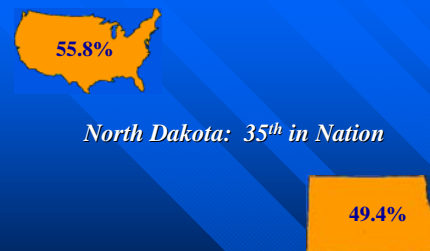

Percentage of the Population



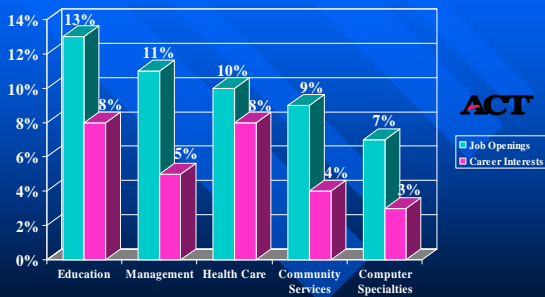

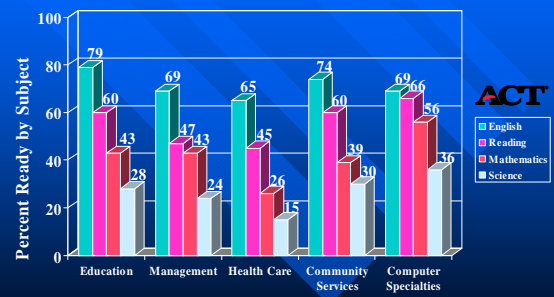
Projected Annual Job Openings and North Dakota High School Students' Interests in High Growth North Dakota Career Fields

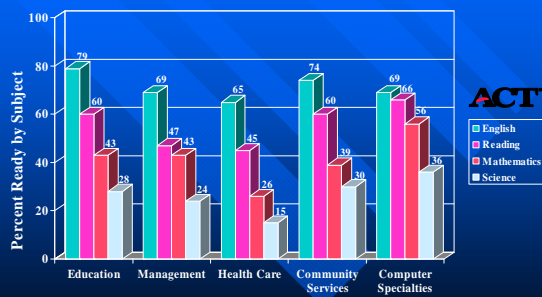

ACT College Readiness Benchmark Performance of ND High School Students Interested in High Growth ND Career Fields by Subject



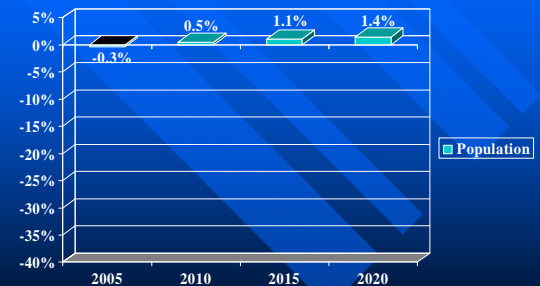

ACT College Readiness Benchmark Performance of ND High School Students Interested in High Growth ND Career Fields by Subject



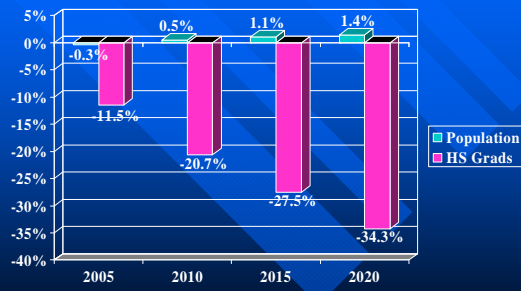

North Dakota Projected Change in Population and High School Graduates Based on 2000 Census

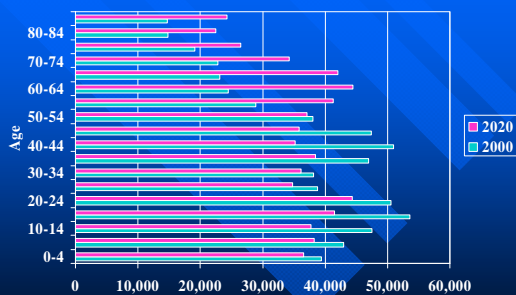
