**Representative DeKrey**: This is a technical correction. It was found in Code that ten one hundredths had not been changed to eight hundredths.

Chairman Ruby: This is a civil action not a criminal action, correct?

Representative DeKrey: Yes, it matches up with what our criminal procedure is now: .08.

Representative Potter: What are exemplary damages?

Tim Dawson, Legislative Assembly: Exemplary damages are punitive damages. This says that if you have been previously convicted in the last five years and again get another DUI; then you don't have to go through the procedures of proving malice or whatnot to file for punitive damages after you file for the case. It is a secondary motion that you make in a civil proceeding. You have to overcome some burdens in subsection 1; and those burdens are met if you can show this fact scenario: two DUI's in five years.

Representative De Krey introduced the bill and said it came about when he was researching another bill and he found a code that was missed in the DUI code. Tim Dawson found the place missed in code when we went from ten one-hundredths of one percent by weight to eight one-hundredths of one percent by weight.
