Senator Lyson Do you foresee a problem with the number of licenses given out if our deer population declines?

Roger Ross there would be a change in the number of licenses the first year. There would probably be another 100 kids who would be eligible to get a license, after that the cycle would reset itself and the same number of kids would be eligible each year.


