Parrell Grossman, AAG, Fraud Division: Support. The AG and I have reviewed this legislation and we support this. It's always a good idea to make available the process of filing an incident report, whether it is the police department or another law enforcement agency. The bill clarifies that the victim can file an incident report where they live, or where the crime or incident occurred. That is a good thing. As the committee may be aware, the creditors, etc. really require that there be a filing of a police report in order to authenticate the commission of the crime or identity theft.

Rep. Koppelman: Is this a problem, that local law enforcement doesn't want to file a report for the victim. Does existing law not do this.

Chairman DeKrey: We will take a look at HB 1184.

Rep. Koppelman: This is the bill having to do with identity theft and police reports. We passed this out of committee quite a while ago, and it was on the Floor, and I was the carrier.

The reason we brought it back to the committee, because there was a little bit of discussion while it was here, about whether or not that this mirrored something we already had in statute, and further investigation shows that it does. So we're proposing an amendment which I think will put it in the proper section.

Rep. Delmore: It doesn't totally mirror that other law. It changes the location of where people may file the identity theft report with the police.

Rep. Koppelman: That's correct. There's one thing that is different about the bill vs. current law. We enacted legislation a few years ago which deals with law enforcement agencies being required to take police reports for identity theft. That is important because when people have an identity theft claim, one of the first requirements in federal statutes, some of the credit card companies, some of the credit card reporting agencies ask where your police report is. The dilemma we are running into years ago, if you went to your local police and told them that you were a victim of identity theft and they looked into it and said this identity theft occurred in New

Jersey (the credit card company) we don't have any jurisdiction over that, we can't investigate

that. They simply wouldn't take a report. So we enacted legislation about four years ago, to

ensure that they needed to take a report, if you take it to the police or law enforcement agency

where you live, they have to take a report. This bill sought to do that again, but we've already

done it; what the bill does as Rep. Delmore points out, it is different in that it also requires that

a law enforcement entity in the jurisdiction where the offense occurred would need to take a

report, and they probably would do that anyway because it's in their jurisdiction, but we think it

is important to amend current law with that provision to just ensure that it can either be taken

where you live or where the offense occurred. I move that we reconsider our action to HB

1184.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1184

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 51-31-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to law enforcement reports for individuals who are the victims of identity theft.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 51-31-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1. An individual who has learned or reasonably suspects that the individual's personal identifying information has been unlawfully used by another, as described in section 12.1-23-11, may initiate a law enforcement investigation by contacting the local law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over the individual's residence or any other jurisdiction in which any part of the offense occurred. The law enforcement agency shall take a report of the matter, provide the individual with a copy of that report, and begin an investigation of the facts. If the suspected crime was committed in a different jurisdiction, the local law enforcement agency may refer the matter to the law enforcement agency where the suspected crime was committed for further investigation of the facts."

Representative Lois Delmore – Introduces the bill, explains the bill. The intent of the bill is to allow a victim to file a report for identity theft in a county other than where they reside.

Senator Nething – States, basically it is to broaden the jurisdiction from the residence to where the theft occurred.

Rep. Delmore – Replies, yes, this is just to have a report on file for creditors that you were a victim of identity theft.

Senator Fiebiger – He wonders how big a problem is this and what about the jurisdiction.

Senator Olafson – Said he is trying to understand the advantage to the victim.
