The Bill allows as a deduction from income, the real estate taxes for property located in the state, for the purposes of determining medical assistance eligibility.

The Department does not expect a fiscal impact for individuals receiving nursing care services in an institution as federal regulations do not allow a property tax deduction. If the Bill is intended for non-institutionalized individuals who receive nursing care services in the community, federal regulations require that the deduction be allowed for all aged and disabled individuals living in the community. This expansion would have a fiscal impact; however, the department does not have property tax data to allow for calculation of a fiscal impact.
