Testimony of Jeb Oehlke HCR 3022 February 10, 2009

Ms. Chairman and committee members my name is Jeb Oehlke. I am here today representing the North Dakota Chamber of Commerce, the voice of North Dakota Business. Our organization is an economic and geographical cross section of North Dakota's private sector and also includes state associations, local chambers of commerce, development organizations, convention and visitors bureaus and public sector organizations. For purposes of this hearing we are also representing fifteen local chambers with total membership over 6,500 members. A list of those associations is attached. As a group we stand in support of HCR 3022.

Funding for education in this state continues to increase, even while enrollment in our schools declines. The business community of this state recognizes that one of the main reasons for this trend is because of the federally mandated programs our schools must administer while they receive no federal funding to do so. These federal mandates have resulted in the need to substantially increase state funding for education while at the same time requiring the school districts to raise more money from local sources which leads to continually increasing property taxes.

The continuation of this trend will soon lead to the need for education funding which is out of reach for our state, even with our current level of prosperity. We cannot continue to increase state funding for education by 15 percent or more every two years without expecting it to catch up with us sooner or later.

Our childrens' education is extremely important for the continued growth of this state. And we believe we are better equipped to make the program choices which work best for North Dakota than those in D.C. making global decisions for the country as a whole and requiring the states and school districts to pick up the tab.

We urge the committee to give HCR 3022 a Do Pass recommendation. I am happy to stand for any questions.

For the record, my name is Mike Schatz and I'm a representative from Dist. 36.

HCR 3022 is probably a resolution that has been put up before and will be again. It asks Congress to send money if it wants to mandate programs and policies in education.
