Rep. Karen Karls: I worked in a lab in college, and we had procedures listed on the wall. We had chemical baths. We had hoods. Do you think they don't have a protocol now?

Rep. DeKrey: If I remember right, those safety features were there when I was in college too. Obviously something went wrong or I don't think they would have had an explosion. Her main concern was that after this explosion, the people in the lab and the janitorial people all just came in and cleaned it up just like you would have when you spilled water on the floor. She felt that couldn't have been right. There should have been some kind of a response that reflected that there could be something there that wouldn't be safe for people to be around and it was just treated like an almost every day household spill. They firmly believe that the results of that explosion in that lab was her cancer, and I don't know what medical proof of that.

**Rep. Bob Hunskor**: Do you know if the family went to the responsible parties—administrator, supervisors?

Chairman Freborg opened the hearing on HCR 3043. All members were present.

Representative DeKrey testified in favor of the bill. He introduced the resolution for a constituent. He had a good friend who had a bad experience with a lab accident and now has breast cancer and is dying. The constituent always felt the lab accident contributed to her disease. That is the gist of the resolution.

Senator Bakke asked if there have been a substantial number of injuries in labs at the college level.

Representative DeKrey said he believes it was an isolated incident. This would be an opportunity to study the situation.

Senator Bakke asked if the North Dakota University System has a policy on lab safety issues.

Representative DeKrey said he doesn't know, he would guess they do.

Chairman Freborg closed the hearing on HCR 3043.

Senator Taylor asked if Legislative Council has flexibility in undertaking this study.

Senator Flakoll said with resolutions, it doesn't matter if it says "shall study" or "shall consider studying", they carry the same weight.

Senator Bakke asked if it says "directed to study" if it is a required study.

Senator Flakoll said he understands it would not be required. The Legislative Council can choose to study or not to study. It is only mandated if it is in a bill and the bill says "shall study".

Senator Bakke moved a Do Pass on HCR 3043, seconded by Senator Taylor.

Senator Bakke said the study would not be required and Legislative Council can choose if they want to study it. She hasn't heard of a lot of issues or safety concerns in the North Dakota University System labs. It would put forth the idea.

Senator Flakoll said he has worked in university labs. Typically, there are one or two visits per year from OSHA. NIH has incredibly strict procedures and EPA has strict guidelines. It sounds like this one incident was an accident. There are layers and layers of safeguards in place already.

The motion passed 3-2. Senator Bakke will carry the resolution.
