Linda Butts, Deputy Director for Driver and Vehicle Services testified in favor of SB2148. See attachment #1.

Senator Nething asked her to explain the process.

Butts replied that this was for renewals and you could go online and order your tabs through this process, using your credit card.

Glen Jackson, NDDOT, further explained how the online payment works.

Senator Fiebigger asked if there have been any problems that precipitated this.

Jackson said there had been more than a handful and that is why the bill is here to consider.

He explained that the receipt is printed online and tabs are mailed out.

Senator Fiebiger asked if there were any security issues.

Jackson replied that he was very confident that there will not be fraud.

Senator Lee asked if fifteen days was enough.

Jackson replied that he believed fifteen days would be enough because of the time table they have put forward.

Senator Lee asked if when stopped, if everyone has that capability to make that verification?

Representative Weiler opened the hearing on SB 2148.

Glenn Jackson, Director of the Drivers License and Traffic Safety Division for the North Dakota DOT, presented SB 2148. See attachment #1.

Representative Vigesaa: Is fifteen days enough time when the online process is utilized?

Glenn Jackson: It is. If someone renews online, it goes into our batch printing process. The most time between the time they renew and the time the batch prints is three working days.

So they print it, it is mailed in two days after that. Fifteen days should be plenty of time. It should be received within five to seven days at the most.

Representative Potter: Will there be an additional fee with the online registration?

Glenn Jackson: There will be no additional fees.

Representative Vigesaa: Do you know what percentage are using online renewals?

Glenn Jackson: Right now about 18.4% of our renewals are done online. It has ste

Glenn Jackson: Right now about 18.4% of our renewals are done online. It has steadily increasing. It spiked in October to 24%, when gas prices really went up. The biggest complaint that we have gotten is that they can get this receipt on the last day of the month, and they can still get stopped and get a ticket. That won't show that they have renewed their vehicle.

Representative Delmore: With this bill will it be registered when the highway patrol checks? Will I have a receipt that I print, or that you print?

Glenn Jackson: It will be a receipt that you printed when you renewed. If you get stopped by the police they can see the receipt that you have, but by checking your vehicle registration, they can access the file and verify that it is renewed right now.

Representative Frantsvog: Is the online renewal available 24/7?

Glenn Jackson: That is correct.

Representative Gruchalla: Are you looking at a way to do the complete process online without having to mail anything out? We will get to a time when we don't need tabs?

Glenn Jackson: We mail out the registration tabs, so there is no way to avoid that. At some point, all vehicles may have bar codes, but we are a long way from that technology.

Representative Potter: With the registration process through the mail, it has to be signed.

With this process there is no signature. Is there a concern with that?

Glenn Jackson: The signature verifies that you have insurance. The online form has a box to check to verify that.

There was not opposition to SB 2148.

The hearing to SB 2148 was closed.

Representative Delmore moved a Do Pass on SB 2148.

Representative Gruchalla seconded the motion.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. My name is Linda Butts, I am the Deputy Director for Driver and Vehicle Services at the North Dakota Department of Transportation. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to present information to you today.

The North Dakota Department of Transportation pre-filed Senate Bill 2148 as an agency bill. This bill will enable individuals who pay their annual renewal for their vehicle online the opportunity to use the receipt as proof of payment for up to fifteen days from their payment date. This will allow the NDDOT time to process, print and mail their registration tabs. This will enable vehicle owners to provide proof of vehicle registration immediately and avoid a penalty for driving without proper vehicle registration.
