Rep. Wolf: How would a restriction appear at the County Recorder.

Malcolm Brown: It could be a notation on the Trust itself, although people record a short notice that the Trust has been created and maybe someone had put in there who has the power to sell it. That might be something that they record.

Rep. Wolf: Would that be filed in district court or where.

Malcolm Brown: Trusts do not have to be filed any place. Sometimes they are filed with the district court if it requires ongoing supervision; but more often than that, they aren't. What you might see is a deed from John Smith to the Smith Family Trust, or from John Smith to Agnes Smith, Trustee of the Smith Family Trust. That might be all that you see. If that's all there is, then this addition to the statute would let a title examiner know that the trustee has the power to sell the property.

Rep. Vig: The word presumed is in there. How often is the presumption declared false. Is that pretty easily done.

My name is Malcolm H. Brown. I am an attorney appearing on behalf of the Real Property Section of the State Bar Association of North Dakota. This bill was drafted and introduced by Senators Holmberg and Hogue at the request of our Section.

The Uniform Trust Code was enacted by the 2007 Legislature. Our Section was concerned that an older section of the law regarding the powers of a trustee with reference to real estate was repealed by the new Trust Code, and the new Trust Code was rather vague as to the trustee of the trust transferring title to real property. Thus, we have proposed in this bill a new section to Chapter 47-10 of the Century Code that specifically states that the trustee of the trust that holds title to real property is presumed to have the power to sell, convey and encumber the property unless restrictions appear in the records of the county recorder.
