RE: SB 2282 - Trade Names

SB 2282 was introduced at the request of the Secretary of State.

Last year, the Securities Commission advised the Secretary of State that franchise names were being improperly registered with the Secretary of State's office as trade names. Since franchise names are owned by the franchisor and not by the franchisee, the franchisee could not legally register the franchise trade name.

With the assistance of the Secretary of State's assigned Assistant Attorney General, this bill was drafted to address the issue.

Section 1 enables a business operating with a franchise name to file a name disclosure document, which creates a public record of the business entity (franchisee) operating under that franchisor's trade name. For example, this public record will reveal the name of the entity operating under that franchise trade name in the event they need to be contacted by law enforcement for a service of process.

Section 2 enables a trade name registrant to amend the nature of business disclosed on a trade name registration. It is not uncommon for registrants of trade names to change the nature of their business during the five year duration of the filing. Therefore, they have often requested the ability to change the nature of business on the trade name registration to more accurately describe their current business activity.

Section 3 of the bill defines who can cancel a trade name registration upon the death of the registrant who is the owner of record on file with the Secretary of State.

Section 1, pages 1 and 2: This creates a new section to Chapter 47-25 to enable a business operating with a franchise name to file a name disclosure document, which creates a public record of the business entity (franchisee) operating under that franchisor's trade name. For example, this public record will reveal the name of the entity operating under that franchise trade name in the event they need to be contacted by law enforcement for a service of process or by a person or entity needing to know if the entity was in good standing.

Section 2, page 2, lines 27 thru 30: This change will enable a trade name registrant to amend the nature of business disclosed on a trade name registration. It is not uncommon for registrants of trade names to change the nature of their business during the five year duration of the filing. Therefore, they have often requested the ability to change the nature of business on the trade name registration to more accurately describe their current business activity.

Section 3, page 2, lines 6 and 7 of the bill defines who can cancel a trade name registration upon the death of the registrant who is the owner of record on file with the Secretary of State.
