Ryan Ziegler: In scouting I've accomplished my goal of obtaining my Eagle. Another exciting goal is I'm going to the National Jamboree. For a lifetime goal for a career, either a firefighter or something related to scouting.

Representative Kasper: In your class in high school, how many were in scouting?

Ryan Ziegler: In my senior class of 90 students, 6 of us became Eagle Scouts.

Representative Kasper: Where is Camp Wilderness?

Ryan Ziegler: Camp Wilderness is about a half hour drive from Park Rapids, Minnesota.

Representative Froseth: Boy Scouts do have problems maintaining active leaders.

Ryan Ziegler: That is why I became a leader to share my knowledge.

Representative Meier: Ryan was one of my Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts and I saw him through to Eagle Scout. I am very proud of him. How many merit badges did you earn?

Ryan Ziegler: 46

Representative Meier: What was your favorite experience?

Ryan Ziegler: Basketry.

Jack Holden, Eagle Scout, Troop 2: I've also worked at Camp Wilderness. I also teach basketry. I serve on the Council Executive Board as the only youth member. I went to the National Order of the Arrow Convention in East Lansing, Michigan two years ago. I've never seen 8,000 better people get together. I've made friends for a lifetime.

Representative Winrich: Of the insignias on your uniform, which one indicates that you are an Eagle Scout?

Jack Holden: Middle one.

Representative Karls: I've heard that the Bismarck School system is denying access to scout groups.

Jack Holden: We are working on it. A lot of principals have very strong feelings. It is just like the military going in and recruiting. I think it is a failure on the school system's part. I was recruited because of a school event.

Representative Froseth: To earn an Eagle status, do you have to put in so many hours for a community project?

Jack Holden: Generally it is over 100 hours. My project was at the Tom O'Leary Golf Course. There's a Rotary Club arboretum, with a sign, with a trail. It was cool working with the Rotary Club.

Representative Meier: What are your plans this summer?

Jack Holden: I'll be working at Camp Wilderness. I'm the Assistant Scout Master which means I do management with the staff. I will go to the National Order of the Arrow Conference in Indiana.

Corey Ralstad, Professional Executive Director: In the elementary students we serve about 30% of the possible boys. We see a drop off in the older boys. We did meet with the school board. They want to figure out a policy that doesn't just apply to us but any youth organization.

Representative Meier: Can you tell about the event that will be hosted on our Capitol grounds in 2010?

Corey Ralstad: That is our 100th birthday. Scouts will be coming from all over the state of ND, Minnesota, South Dakota, and Montana. This event will be open to everyone. They are predicting anywhere from 1500 to 3000 scouts. It will be tents all over. We will also have displays at the Heritage Center.
